► WE ARE A *DEMOCRATIC* PLATFORM:

- ▶ Board: Elected for a two year mandate made up of 11 young volunteers
- Secretariat: 35 young professionals working full-time to support the Board and the Member Organisations in their daily work.

Youth participation

Young people are politically active! They are at the forefront of many global movements and youth-led organisations. They engage politically in different, unconventional ways outside of the traditional political system.

- ► How do we bridge the gap between young people and political institutions?
 - Better citizenship education,
 - Electoral reform and lowering the voting age
 - A rethink of how our **democratic systems** work. Look out for #ChangeisComing **European Elections** campaign!



Strong youth organisations

Youth organisations play an essential role to **empower young people in society.** They contribute to personal, social, political and economic development and can help tackle the key challenges facing Europe, such as youth unemployment, the erosion of social cohesion and political disengagement.

- ▶ How do we strengthen youth organisations?
 - Invest in youth new EU budget must prioritise youth
 - **EU Youth programmes** more accessible Erasmus
 - ▶ Value of youth work recognition of non-formal education



Social and economic inclusion

Being able to find **quality work and to access all social rights** is essential for young people in order to participate fully in society and be autonomous.

- ▶ How to protect and promote social rights for young people?
 - Quality jobs policies that ensure fair working conditions
 - Social inclusion equal opportunities for education and employment
 - More social Europe more funding for EU programmes like Youth Employment Initiative.



Sustainable development

We need to shape a future where we value both people and planet. With so much inequality, limited resources and the threat of climate change, young generations will be at the forefront of the fight for a more sustainable world.

- ► How can we build a sustainable future?
 - **▶ Empower young voices** make sure young people are setting the agenda.
 - ▶ Sustainable Development Goals Europe is falling behind. Young people have a strong role to play.
 - ▶ Mainstream sustainability more than just ticking a box!
















