An open platform for more effective technical cooperation

In June 2009 EuropeAid launched www.capacity4dev.eu as a central component of the <u>Backbone Strategy</u> for Technical Cooperation (TC) reform. It is developed as a user-friendly yet powerful knowledge management platform using state of the art Web 2.0 technologies.

What is offered through www.capacity4dev.eu

The platform will support interactivity, collaboration, knowledge sharing and exchange both inside the EC and with the rest of the world, including with partner countries, Member States and other donors, academia and civil society, through:

- High value content and resources, including:
- o News, editorials, interviews in the form of a regularly updated "magazine";
- o Guidance, tools, peer support in the form of Q&A, Frequently Asked Questions
- o Hands-on practical information, case studies on good/innovative practice, tips etc
- Online workgroups, discussion forums and collaboration spaces and various tools to facilitate communication among others between HQ and Delegations, among Delegations and with other stakeholders.

Key priorities:

The initial focus will be on supporting the daily work of EC staff, partners and stakeholders, to better design and manage TC, facilitating the exchange and learning on new TC approaches, inline with the Accra Agenda for Action.

Six topics are identified as a priority:

- <u>Capacity Development</u>: This section will include resources about approaches to capacity development; capacity assessment tools; country and sector level strategies for CD; CD for private sector and civil society; change management; and donor support modalities.
- <u>Public Sector Reform and Decentralisation</u>: Public sector reform will span resources related to big scale reforms and sector reform; decentralisation and devolution; anti-corruption reform; public and private service delivery; civil service reform and performance and quality enhancement processes.

- <u>Public Financial Management</u>: Public expenditure management (PEM) functions, tools and controls; revenue; procurement; transparency and accountability; legislative scrutiny and public oversight; assessing PFM and PFM reforms.
- <u>Governance</u>: General and sector governance; local governance; democracy; political economy and power; fiscal decentralisation.
- Working with technical cooperation: Country level policies; donor approaches to TC; harmonisation in practice; design of TC support; programme implementation arrangements; monitoring and evaluation of TC; TC quality assurance and TC procedures from A-Z.
- <u>Technical cooperation & aid reforms</u>: The EC reform progress; Linking to the broader aid effectiveness agenda; donor policies on TC; training and in-house events

Contribute content, experience and ideas! You Benefit!

The engine behind www.capacity4dev.eu is the time and energy spent by its users to populate it with high value contents ideas and materials to be shared with the rest of the development community, colleagues or members of their group. We make sure that you get the best possible tools for you to share and exchange information and knowledge and facilitate collaboration with colleagues and the development community at large.

What to contribute:

Resources: projects, documents and reports, any documentation illustrating good practices, Terms of References, guidance and methodologies, video clips, reports/evaluations, links, studies, abstracts of academic books, articles, material from conferences/events, your thoughts and notes, etc.

I deas and contacts: Suggestions on innovative uses of the platform, on colleagues or others external partners (partner countries, experts, donors, researchers) who might have good stories to tell or that should be interviewed / invited to contribute contents and experience.

How to contribute:

Once the platform is launched you will be able to contribute and engage online using the various possibilities offered throughout the site.

You can upload relevant documents, files links etc: through easily identifiable links across the site you can upload contents through a form. Providing relevant information on what you are submitting through the upload form will allow for your contents to be easily found by others and yourself, using for example the search functionality at your disposal.

You can initiate or join discussions on specific issues, where you can share your views and experience with colleagues or the development practitioners at large. This will be easy to do through the "Discussions" page by clicking on the relevant links to join existing discussions or start a new one.

You can create or join work groups, and use a wide array of tools offered to facilitate the collaboration and exchange of information as well as the management of the group member activities online or off line, using calendars, creating events and To-Do lists. This will be easy to do through the "Groups" page clicking on the relevant links to request membership in existing groups or request the creation of a new one.

You can tag (add keywords), comment, rate and add to your favorites most of the contents posted on the platform, helping others and yourself to increase the value of the contents and help better identify the relevant information.

You can share Knowledge and experience online through the Questions and Answers/ Peer Support function of the site which allows for users to ask the development community for support on specific issues. If you happen to know something about it, we encourage you to share it online replying to

these questions. You will of course be able to ask questions as well.

You can share information about you and your area of practice, through your profile. Filling in this information is not compulsory but allows some interesting additional functionalities on the site such as finding colleagues and other practitioners that share the same work interests, receiving notifications about new activities or contents submitted in specific fields you are interested in etc. This will be easily done through your "Profile" page.

Who has access to www.capacity4dev.eu and how

There are 4 different levels of access to the platform:

- 1. <u>Unregistered visitors:</u> of the site will be able to see all contents uploaded for public use but will not benefit from the interactive features of the platform or participation in discussion or groups.
- 2. <u>Registered users</u>: will be able to access all contents uploaded for public use and will benefit from the interactive features of the platform and will be able to join or create discussions and groups
- 3. Registered EC Staff: will be able to access all contents uploaded for public use and documents uploaded for "Internal use" (EC Only). They will of course benefit as well from the interactive features of the platform and will be able to join or create groups.
- 4. <u>Members of Work-Groups:</u> Registered users can create or join Work-Groups. All members of a group can access all contents belonging to the group. If the group is open to the general public its contents are accessible to visitors as well.

What is public and what is for "EC internal use" only:

The general policy is that "everything the Commission produces is public unless specific exceptions apply". These exceptions include among others, disclosure of personal or financial data concerning third parties. Contents submitted indicating that they are for "Internal EC use" will be accessible only to EC staff. If you are unsure just signal it to us and we will look into it.

How www.capacity4dev.eu is run

The development, content and community management and maintenance of the platform is ensured by a broad governance scheme coordinated by the "Quality monitoring systems and methodologies" unit in EuropeAid (Unit E5). The technical development and maintenance is ensured by the EC Joint Research Centre (JRC) / IES in ISPRA.
