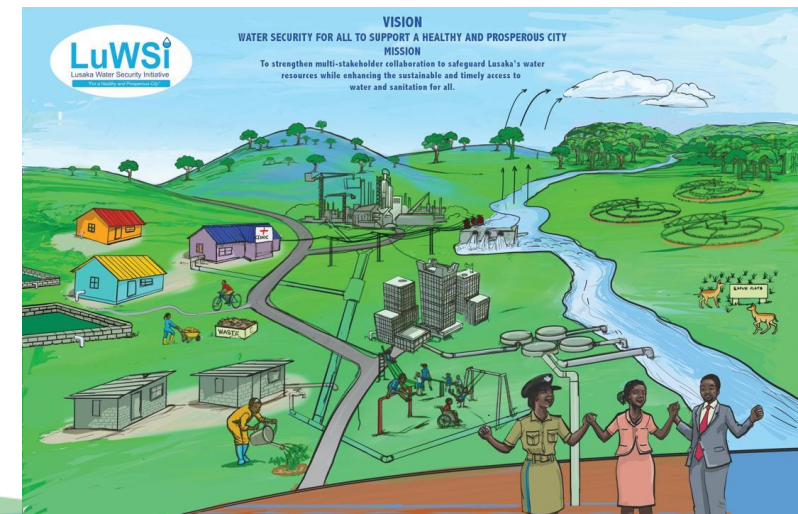


LuWSI's Water Security Action Areas

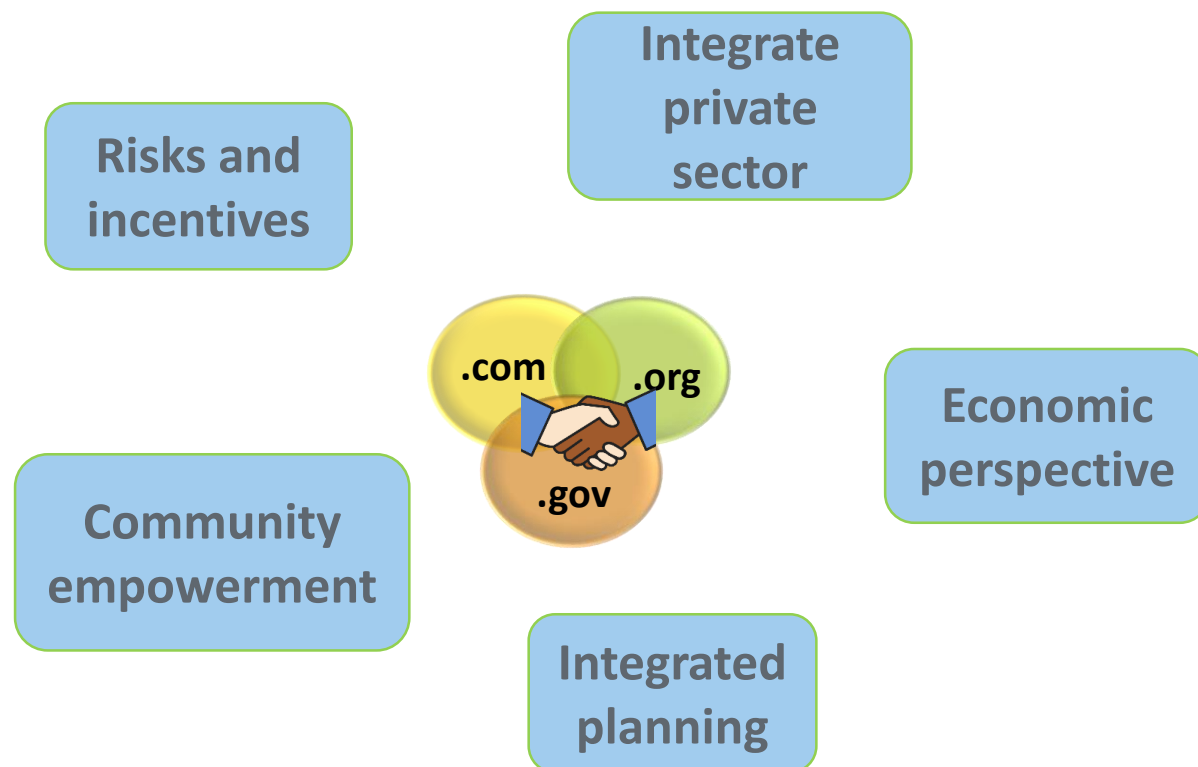
1. Groundwater pollution prevention
