



NDICI breakdown: new, geographic approach

Key features

Except for geo cooperation with pre-accession and overseas countries/territories
- **Legal obligation for official development assistance**
92% of total envelop
- **Budgetising the EDF**
Based on preconditions
- **Ring fencing**
Regions
- **Multiannuality**
Importing EDF responsiveness

Key features (2)

Environment and climate change

Spending target for climate objectives

- Overall target across the multiannual financial framework: 25%
- Specific NDICI target: 25%

Mainstreaming

- Climate change and environment protection will be mainstreamed throughout all NDICI actions – increased importance in light of the Green Deal.



Key features (3)

Streamlined financial tools

European Fund for Sustainable Development (EFSD+) and the External Action Guarantee (EAG):

- Policy first approach
- Expand investments worldwide
- Increase potential to guarantee operations
- Provide replenishment from geographic envelopes

2019: **European Parliament and Council establish positions**

Trilogues launched

2020: **Negotiations with co-legislators ongoing**

Jan 2021: **NDICI enters into force**
