

International climate issues – Stepping up climate diplomacy and working in the UNFCCC negotations

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Recent global developments on ambition

- More scientific research and UN reports UN SG intensifies outreach
- More than 70 countries announce efforts to achieve net-zero emissions by 2050 – including the EU and CAN.
- ...however, China, US, Japan, Australia, South Africa and India and many others have made no promises – and US election outcome remains a major unknown
- Real economy steps-up game: Several asset fund managers commit to netzero portfolio of investments by 2050, dozens of businesses, states and local governments committed to Paris Agreement
- Extinction rebellion and Greta Thunberg led youth movement vocally condemn leaders for their "business as usual"



Green Deal and the External dimension of EU Climate Policy

- "Traditional" Climate and energy diplomacy now combined with targeted political dialogues,
 clear articulation of expectations, and development cooperation
- Multilateral engagement will remain the central plank, but more accent on "bilateralisation" and "geographisation" of strategies working in synch with EEAS, DEVCO, NEAR and relevant line DGs to substantiate dialogues (ENER, GROW, RTD, FISMA, MOVE, MARE ...)
- Trade policy to promote uptake new technologies, balance between "carrots and sticks" plausible threat of Border Measures vs. incentivising regulatory approximation.
- Progressives Alliances and partnerships coherence in projecting shared values. "Do no harm".
 Genuine promotion of multilateralism. The Ministerial for Climate Action (MoCA), High Ambition Coalition (HAC), other progressives and G20/G7.
- Exploit full scope of sustainable finance action plan Taxonomy, carbon disclosure, thresholds and green labelling in massive demand in the international financial markets – need for "gold/green standards"

What is in the cards for the coming months and years – "Quo Vadis?"

- Climate diplomacy conclusions 20/01/2020 constructive but assertive
 Union
- EEAS "Deep dive" instructions to selected EU delegations
- Whole Economy approach to programming credible projection of the Green Deal Priorities => EU example the most compelling argument for the benefits transition
- Programming of the external heading instruments
- Decisive use of EU and MSs privileged relations in third cous
- Focus on external coherence




Paris, EU and Ambition

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- ECFIN COUNCIL Nov 2019: Confirms EU and MS have nearly doubled contributions since 2013, reaching €21.7 billion in 2018
- EU COUNCIL Dec 2019: "Endorses the objective of achieving a climate-neutral EU by 2050, in line with the objectives of the Paris Agreement" and "takes note of the Commission Communication on the European Green Deal"

• The VDL Commission Dec 2019: Adopts the European Green Deal, including Climate Law including 2050 LTS by March 2020; Climate Pact; "Climate Bank"; 50/55% by 2030 target/IA by Summer 2020/legislative proposals by 2021; and the EU to "lead international negotiations to increase the ambition of other major emitters by 2021"


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The Outcomes from COP25 Madrid

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Ambition	 GCA popular and is continued post- 2020; Youth takes to the streets 100+ Parties commit to enhance NDCs in 2020 	 No major economies commit to enhance ambition (though Commission launches EGD) Weak language in cover decision on enhancing NDCs
Implementation	Agreed: gender action plan, response measures work programme, capacity building, oceans dialogue	
Adaptation, L&D	Agreed: expert group and network launched on finance for L&D	Postponed: Long term governance of L&D
Finance	Agreed: Guidance to GEF/GCF	Postponed: Issue of long-term finance
Transparency		Delayed: progress on the details of the transparency framework
Carbon Markets (Article 6)	Launched: San Jose Principles for High Ambition and Integrity in International Carbon Markets	Postponed: decisions on accounting for carbon markets and design of a new offset mechanism
