
Marine Biodiversity is rapidly declining






The Climate and Ocean Nexus –a catch 22 ?!

Council Conclusions on Oceans and Seas (14249/19)

- INVITES the Commission to analyse the SCROCC report and propose policy response options; CALLS for **increased policy action at all governance levels**.
- SUPPORTS the follow-up and further development of the IOG Agenda
- CALLS ON the EU and its Member States to promote and build capacity for better ocean governance (biodiversity, cumulative pressures, sustainable blue economies)












The High Seas of the world

A process called BBNJ

- -a package deal to articulate UNCLOS obligations further:
 - Area-based management tools, including MPAs
 - Environmental Impact Assessments
 - Capacity Building and Transfer of Marine Technology
 - Marine Genetic Resources







Follow-up to SROCC report

- Active support to ocean and climate change dialogue in June this year objective on strengthening mitigation and adaptation action (COP25 decision in preparation for COP26)
- Support to blue carbon protection and restoration
- Promote recognition of climate and ocean nexus





2020 UN Ocean Conference Lisbon, 2-6 June 2020

- 2 EU Statements at the 1st preparatory meeting
- Implementation of 2017 UN Ocean conference commitments reported
- Study on 'EU policy tools in the field of SDG 14 and other ocean-related Agenda 2030 targets
- Internal preparations for commitments in Lisbon
