15th Summer School Cinema, Human Rights and Advocacy

The 15th edition of the Summer School in Cinema Human Rights and Advocacy is a training initiative jointly developed by the Global Campus of Human Rights and Picture People. The course is aimed at young professionals wishing to broaden their understanding on the connections between human rights, films, digital media and video advocacy, to share ideas and foster participatory and critical thinking on urgent human rights issues, debate with experts and filmmakers from all over the world during the 77th Venice International Film Festival and learn how to use films as a tool for social and cultural change.

THE PROGRAMME

The School offers an exciting programme of lectures, film screenings, discussions, working groups and a storytelling workshop that combine human rights expertise, media studies and video advocacy strategies.

As part of the programme participants are required to watch and analyse a selection of human rights related screenings at the 77th Venice International Film Festival. Whenever possible, filmmakers, jury members and critics from the cinema world are invited to discuss their work with the Summer School participants. Participants will be given a Cinema category accreditation pass to the Film Festival giving access to a selection of festival screenings.

THE FACULTY

The faculty is composed by internationally acclaimed experts in film, television, photography and human rights working under the coordination of the two programme directors **Nick Danziger**, photographer and filmmaker, and **Claudia Modonesi**, human rights expert and media trainer, who will also conduct a visual storytelling workshop throughout the duration of the school providing participants with the basic skills to develop a short film / media /advocacy project to be pitched during the school's final session.

TUITION WAIVERS

The Global Campus is offering up to **16 tuition waivers** to professionals and students whose field of expertise and research focuses on **children rights** and are, or wish to become, leaders in their community and worldwide to promote and protect the rights of the child through the connections between human rights, films, digital media and video advocacy.

Venue: Global Campus of Human Rights headquarters in Venice Lido at the Monastery of San Nicolò

Admission requirements: Graduates, professionals of the human rights, media, NGO, advocacy and the third (voluntary) sector and anyone who uses or is interested in using audio-visual media as a tool for promoting social change are encouraged to apply to the Summer School. The School selects a maximum of 30 participants.
