

Emergency measures must be necessary, proportionate, non-discriminatory and timebound


In practice

Measures have deprioritized, discriminated and excluded older persons from treatment, support, testing, protective equipment, etc



Age-based confinement

Triage



Neglect

- Limited staff
- No PPE
- No testing
- No visitors
- No transfer to hospitals
- Lack of data
