Institutional set-up


- **Ministry of Foreign Affairs:** prepares IDC strategy , manages multilateral contributions (UN, EU-EDF, GEF) and implements bilateral projects and provides humanitarian assistance.
 - Currently 12 staff at HQ + embassies involved in project identification and implementation
 - No implementing agency
 - Cooperation with NGO's: Regular consultation („open door” policy, ad-hoc consultations, Advisory Committee, calls for proposals, support to EU bids)
- **Line Ministries:** manage multilateral contributions (WB, IMF, EBRD, IOM, FAO) and implement „development-related” projects.

Hungarian development cooperation

Set of partner countries (since 2008):

- Priority countries: Serbia, BIH, Moldova, Vietnam, Palestine Authority
- Project based partners: Ukraine, Kosovo, Montenegro, FYROM, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Yemen, Laos, Cambodia, Sub-Saharan Africa, Afghanistan, Iraq


Bilateral ODA in 2011 by regions

Multilateral ODA by organisations


EU (dev. budget + EDF)	83,07%
