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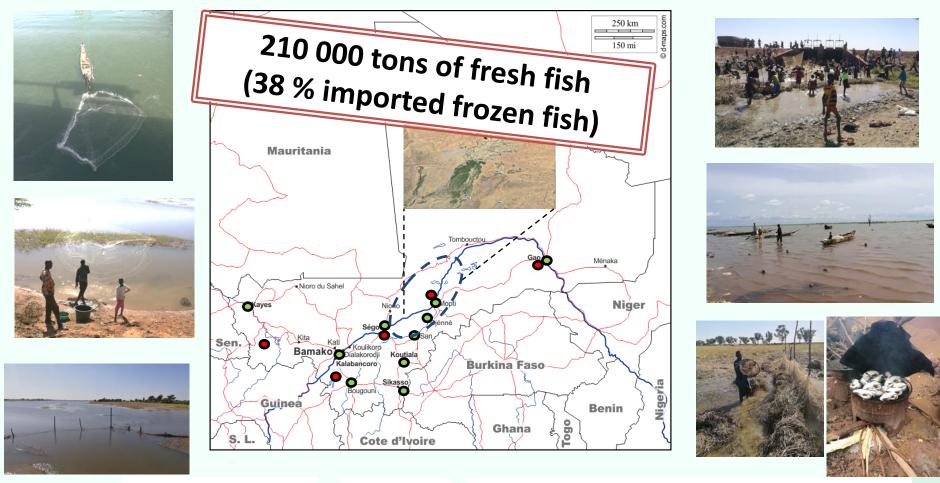

Disruptions in the VC and pathways

Products of VC		Total fresh volume (%)	Possible disruptions
	Opportunity fishermen - riparian population	13.5%	Increase of opportunity fishers, pressure on resources (T)
	Fresh local markets (small fresh fish)	12%	Diversification of income into polluting activities (T)
	Fresh fish urban and countryside markets (noble fish)	11%	Drop of local consumption due to loss of purchasing power (T)
	Smoked fish – local markets	10%	Fishmongers revenues affected especially for women due to closed markets (T)
	Smoked fish urban and countryside markets	13%	Increase fish processing and direct links between fishermen and consumers (O)
	Export smoked fish	2%	Increase of smoked fish exports (O)
	Imported frozen fish small pelagic marine fishing	30%	Disruptions in supply chain, closed frontiers, lower supply and higher prices 10 to 20% (T)
	Imported frozen fish Asian fish farming	8%	Higher sells of Malian fish? (O)
	Re-export frozen fish	0.5%

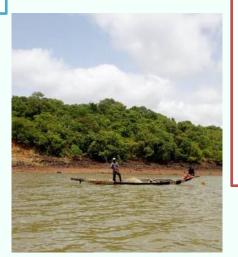

Diversification of processing methods to stock longer

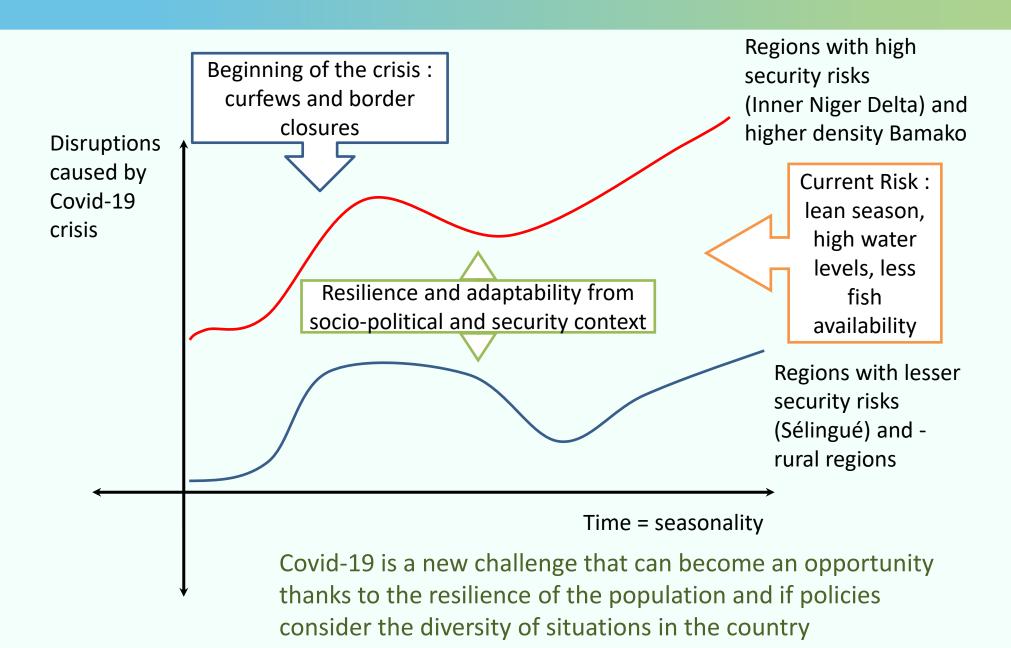


- Strategies to send the fish to markets (canoes)

- •Reduced fish consumption due to higher prices (in cities at the beginning of the crisis)

Concluding remarks: lessons learned

Fisheries in Mali are an asset for development, the resilience of populations and food security:

- ➤ Better recognition of the fishermen knowledge
- Clearly define the land status/ land access of fishermen



- ➤ Generate collective activities to **identify and support actors directly** and facilitate their empowerment (fishmongers and fishermen)
- ➤ Development of **extensive** fish-farming **systems** (rice-fish farming) or grow small fish before sale (with no concentrated feed) as **diversification** of fishing activities
