#### Survey among DEAR Stakeholders

Quick overview on methodology:

- Online survey (Nov-Dec 2020)
- 13 questions overall, mainly open questions
- Only 2 compulsory questions
- Respondents are DEAR stakeholders working on DE/GE in various capacity across Europe

## Does the current EU DEAR Programme complement sufficiently the national DEAR/GE programmes?



#### HOW TO STRENGTHEN COMPLEMENTARITY?

- Multi-level policy dialogue for peer-learning and knowledge-sharing
- EU coordination and (financial) support for national plans
- Funds for initiatives in EU MS where DEAR is weaker
- !>> Strengthening the Pan-European nature of DEAR projects (7)
- ! >> Reduce the size of consortia (7)
- Greater involvement of smaller organisations
- Involving other fora in consultations on future DEAR calls
- Promote cross-sectoral cooperation at all levels





# What measures should be taken to increase the coherence and impact of the EU DEAR Programme as a whole?

- Embrace the diversity of the existing DEAR: no to a centralised intervention logic
- Set up high level programme objectives and ensure all projects contribute to their achievement
- Ensure support for more structured and coordinated cooperation and exchange
- Reduce the size of projects and consortia
- Maintain sub-granting options to reach smaller locally targeted players
- Longer-term and stable funding, regular and transparent CfP, core funding vs. project grants.
- Be sensitive to the country-specific contexts







# What could be done to collect/aggregate (more) meaningful information about the results of the DEAR programme, especially at the level of outcomes and impact?



- Use qualitative data collection methods (together with quantitative data)
- A reframed DEAR-specific model of M&E to keep it 'simple and tailor-made'
- Establish uniform reporting and monitoring for all projects (and Member States)
- Create a simple online platform as common reporting database
- A closer follow up from EC task managers
- Use the "Engagement pyramid" among the monitoring tools









- Facilitating exchange between stakeholders
- Offering guidelines or feedback on DEAR, shaping priorities
- Supporting action towards DEAR targets
- Evaluating DEAR

- Past and ongoing projects

- Private sector



## What other measures could be taken to strengthen the usefulness and relevance of this grouping?

Call for greater transparency and openness of the work of the MSG

#### For example:

- Making part of meetings open
- Emphasis on non-hierarchical exchange
- Greater follow-up of decisions, with results made public
- Regular stocktaking of the group's role and functions
- Clearer and better defined role
