


## ICELANDIC DEVELOPMENT COOPERATION





### History – Framework

- 1971 Act on Iceland's Assistance to the Developing Countries (No 20/1971)
- 1981 Act on ICEIDA, Icelandic International Development Agency (No 43/1981)
- 2001 Iceland Crisis Response Unit
- 2007 Act on the Icelandic Crisis Response Unit and its Participation in International Crisis Response (No 73/2007)
- 2008 Act on Iceland's International Development Cooperation (No 121/2008)
- 2009 Regulation No 894/2009 on the implementation of International Development Cooperation
- 2009 Directorate for International Development Cooperation (at the MFA)



#### LEGISLATION

- Act No 121/2008 on Iceland's International Development Cooperation
  - Entered into force October 1, 2008
- Comprehensive framework for Iceland's international development cooperation
- Increase transparency and accountability
- Increase the role of the parliament
- Emphasize civil society and cooperation with NGOs
- Clear reference to international agreements and declarations
- Policy making: Strategy on Iceland's development cooperation



## Implementation of Act No 121/2008 (1)

- The main objective of Iceland's international development cooperation
- Achieving the MDGs:
  - Fight against Poverty and Hunger
  - Human Rights
  - Education
  - Improved Health
  - Gender Equality
  - Sustainable Development
  - Sustainable use of Natural Resources



## Implementation of Act No 121/2008 (2)

- ICEIDA Icelandic Development Agency
  - Separate agency under the authority of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs
  - Director General appointed by Minister for Foreign Affairs
- Council on International Development Cooperation
  - Consultative body
  - 17 members: chairperson, 5 from NGOs, 2 from academia, 2 from social partners, 7 members elected by Parliament
- Development Cooperation Committee
  - 7 members elected by Parliament



## Implementation of Act No 121/2008 (3)


- Regulation on the Implementation of Icelandic International Development Cooperation (No 894/2009)
  - Steering Group on International Development
  - Operates within the MFA
  - 5 members: Permanent Secretary of State (chairman), DG of the Directorate for Intl. Dev. Cooperation, DG of ICEIDA, Director of the Department for International Development and Head of ICRU
- Harmonisation of procedures with regards to planning, monitoring and evaluation
- Strategy for Iceland's International Development Cooperation
- Reporting to Parliament



## Organisational Structure

- Ministry for Foreign Affairs
  - Overall responsibility for Icelandic international development cooperation
- Directorate for International Development Cooperation
  - Department for Multilateral Development Cooperation
    - Multilateral Organisations: UN agencies, World Bank Group
    - Policy: DAC, Nordic+
    - Statistics
    - Cooperation with NGOs
  - Iceland Crisis Response Unit
    - Peace building
    - Secondment of staff to International Organisations
    - Emergency Response
    - Humanitarian Aid
- ICEIDA Icelandic International Development Agency
  - Bilateral Agreements with Partner Countries
  - Regional/Cross-country Cooperation

# ICELAND'S STRATEGY FOR DEVELOPMENT COOERATION 2011 - 2014

- Stipulated by Act no. 121/2008
- In June 2011 the Althingi (Icelandic parliament) adopted a parliamentary resolution on a Strategy for Iceland's Development Cooperation 2011-2014.
- Comprehensive Approach
  - Multilateral and bilateral cooperation
  - Humanitarian assistance
  - Peace-building efforts
- Key principles:
  - Responsibility
    - Transparency and mutual responsibility
  - Results
    - Administration, procedures, methodology to maximise results
  - Reliability
    - Strive for professionalism and to be a reliable partner




#### POINT OF DEPARTURE

- International development cooperation is one of the key pillars of Iceland's foreign policy
- Focus
  - Fight against poverty and hunger, human rights, gender equality, democracy, peace and security
- International commitments
  - The Millennium Development Goals
  - Monterrey Consensus
  - Paris Declaration and Accra Agenda for Action
- Other International Agreements
  - UN Agreements on Human Rights, UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, CEDAW, CCD, UNFCC, UNCLOS

## Strategy 2011-2014: Development Effectiveness

- Emphasis on international agreements on results and aid effectiveness
  - Paris Declaration and Accra Agenda for Action
- Full Membership of the OECD/DAC
- Joint Human Resource Policy for the MFA and ICEIDA
- Joint working groups of experts
  - Gender Equality
  - Natural Resources
  - Aid Effectiveness
- Policy Formulation
  - Gender Equality Strategy
  - Environmental Strategy
  - Country Strategies



#### ICELAND'S ODA - TARGETS

#### Iceland's ODA

- 2000: 0.12% of GNI

- 2008: 0.37% of GNI

- 2010: 0.28% of GNI

- 2011: 0.21% of GNI

## Strategy envisages gradual increase

- 0,5% of GNI by 2017 and 0.7% by 2019

## Revision of target

- Accelerated in 2013 when the Strategy comes up for review
- If GNI grows faster than predicted
