AIM OF THE EVENT

The EU-LAC Common Higher Education Area and the common knowledge Areas are policy macro-objectives supported by a fragmented set of instruments and by a discontinuous level of political priority. However, the academic community of the European Union, Latin America and the Caribbean continue to increase their level of cooperation and confirm their intention to become more “integrated”, while respecting identities and valuing diversity.

In view of the Santiago EU-LAC Summit in January 2013 and in the year in which EU policies and instruments are fine-tuned, the VertebrALCUE Project takes the initiative of organizing a workshop to present its “Green Paper” – and to collect ideas and stimuli for the next decade from people involved in policy making, in international collaboration in HE and Research, in knowledge based Innovation.

Several signals indicate that a deep re-consideration of past models of collaboration and specific EU intervention is necessary.

The HE modernization agenda and the changing power relationship at global level, the fast development of several LA countries and the problematic EU situation in financial economic and political terms, the role taken by ICT in supporting all working processes, including research and teaching/learning, are all elements that suggest to propose a substantially renewed articulation of action lines and new approaches to process monitoring of the implementation of the agreed policy objectives.
