We are welcoming young creative minds, including high-school and university students, journalists, human rights activists and academics to contribute to take part in the discussion with Kumi. The talk will focus on the relation between climate change, human rights and the accelerated movement of people.

ABOUT THE SPEAKER:

Kumi Naidoo started as a social justice campaigner at a young age and took part in an anti-apartheid protest in South Africa. His activism led him to be expelled from high school, several arrests and eventual exile in the UK. He was able to return home when Nelson Mandela was released from prison in 1990 and continued standing for civil society in South Africa. Later in his career Kumi has led several international organisations, including being the Executive Director of Civicus, the Executive Director of Greenpeace International, and the Secretary General of Amnesty International.

Kumi is currently a Richard von Weizsäcker Fellow at the Robert Bosch Academy and Honorary Professor of Practice at Thunderbird School of Global Management at Arizona State University. He lectures at Fossil Free University and serves as Special Advisor to the Green Economy Coalition. Kumi serves as Global Ambassador to Africans Rising for Justice, Peace and Dignity. He is a Visiting Fellow at Oxford University and an Honorary Fellow at Magdalen College.





ABOUT THE MODERATOR:

Kristina Mänd is the coordinator of the "I Am European" project in NGO Mondo. Her passion is rooted in the role of civil society making and in the access to the quality of life.
