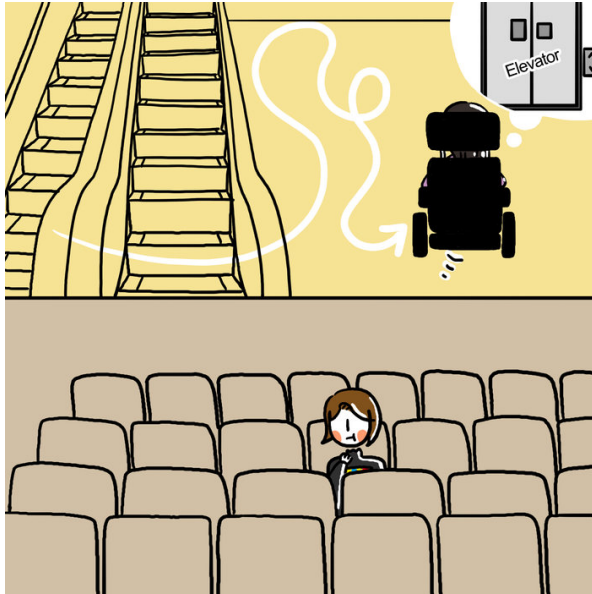
Coming events
