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


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INTERSECTIONAL APPROACH

Intersectionality helps us understand how aspects of a person's social and political identities combine to create different modes and unique experiences of discrimination and privilege.

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The Community Score Card

CSC process

- Citizen-driven accountability approach
- Improve service delivery
- Gather feedback from service users
- Improve communication between service users and service providers

ICSC Make Way process

- Youth-led accountability approach
- Improving available, accessible, acceptable & quality SRH services
- Gather feedback from youth excluded & marginalized due to their identities
- Improve communication youth and duty bearers
- Safety and security considerations
- Use data for health system strengthening



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
The ICSC Process

PHASE 1 PLANNING AND PREPARATION

PHASE II : Conducting the Intersectional Community Scorecard with marginalized youth

PHASE III : Conducting the Intersectional with SRHR Service providers

PHASE IV : Interface Meetings and Action Planning



PHASE V : Action Plan Implementation and Monitoring, building the capacity of CSOs and L&A for health system strengthening

Where has ICSC been conducted?

Kenya, Rwanda and Zambia has conducted ICSC


Youth with compounded vulnerabilities involved as primary actors

Creates platform for participatory change at facility level through interface

Issues raised by youth builds evidence and informs lobby and advocacy for systems change

Lessons that EC can incorporate

- Value clarification: **check your own biases**, beliefs, judgements and practices. Does the organisation make a deliberate effort to **accommodate diverse identities**? Are they included in **decision making**? Who makes the decisions?
- Make way is in the process of developing a guide on **dimensions of intersecting tools** focused on what to consider if you want to intersectionalise a tool
