# Results and Indicators for Development

## General Introduction

The **guidance on thematic results and indicators** covers DG INTPA strategies in various sectors, aiming to enhance the quality of our interventions – in terms of design, monitoring in the course of implementation. It also aims to promote the use of standardized information across European Union-funded interventions in partner countries. [DG INTPA](#) unit in charge of monitoring results ([D.4](#)) and [thematic units](#) developed the guidance.

It is **addressed to EC staff and external partners** involved in the preparation of action documents and project documents, helping them to develop solid logical framework matrices. It identifies clear and measurable results statements in line with DG INTPA policy priorities, as well as with the [UN Sustainable Development Goals \(SDGs\)](#), [NDICI Regulation](#), [Gender Action Plan \(GAP III\)](#) and the [EU Results Framework](#), along with a range of good indicators to monitor progress.

DG INTPA's results reporting and Action Document quality assurance processes identified the **need for such guidance**.

## This guidance presents for each sector:



**1. EU policy priorities:** a short narrative explaining EU policy priorities and commitments as articulated in key policy and strategic documents.



**2. A results chain:** a diagram showing the main results (impact, outcomes, outputs) that EU development interventions are expected to achieve in the given thematic area, reflecting EU policy priorities and commitments.



**3. Thematic indicators:** examples of measurable indicators associated to each result statement, that may be used in Logframe Matrices at project / programme level.

# ☰ 1. EU Policy Priorities



Article 21 of the [Treaty of the European Union](#) states that the European Union is guided by the principles which have inspired its own creation, development and enlargement, and which it seeks to advance in the wider world: democracy, the rule of law, the universality and indivisibility of human rights and fundamental freedoms, respect for human dignity, the principles of equality and solidarity, and respect for the principles of the United Nations Charter and international law.

The [EU Action Plan on Human Rights and Democracy for the period 2020-2024](#) reaffirms EU's strong commitment to further advancing universal values for all. The action plan aims to:

- improve EU leadership on human rights and streamline its decision-making;
- strengthen partnerships with governments, businesses and social partners;
- address accountability gaps and erosion of the rule of law;
- identify where new technologies can help improve human rights.

The new Action Plan 2020-2024 sets out overarching priorities and objectives to be translated and implemented in the next years at all levels: country, regional and multilateral. It builds on the previous action plans and continues to focus on long-standing priorities such as supporting human rights defenders and the fight against the death penalty.

By identifying five interlinked and mutually reinforcing priorities: (1) protecting and empowering individuals; (2) building resilient, inclusive and democratic societies; (3) promoting a global system for human rights and democracy; (4) new technologies: harnessing opportunities and addressing challenges; and (5) delivering by working together, the Action Plan also reflects the changing context with attention to new technologies and to the link between global environmental challenges and human rights. In line with the [EU Gender Action Plan III](#), gender mainstreaming is to be applied throughout all actions to ensure that all measures are gender responsive.

The outbreak of the COVID-19 Pandemic illustrated the importance of multilateralism, global cooperation and solidarity. This means early engagement to address human rights violations and support democracy. A renewed focus on human rights and democracy fosters state and societal resilience. The Action Plan contributes to the implementation of the [2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development](#) and the [Sustainable Development Goals \(SDGs\)](#), enhance the human rights of all, without discrimination on any grounds.

All human rights are embedded across the SDGs, and particularly SDG 16, on democratic governance, rule of law, access to justice and personal security



Although the current Human Rights result chain and indicators are aligned with the latest Action Plan, it needs to be noted that human rights encompass a number of specific sectors, for which separate results chains with corresponding indicators have been developed. Interested parties are encouraged to visit these distinct results chains and indicators, especially the ones covering [Democracy](#), [Justice Sector Reform](#), [Resilience](#), [Conflict Sensitivity and Peace](#), [Education](#), [Nutrition](#), [Social Protection](#) [Forced Displacement](#), and [Gender Equality](#).

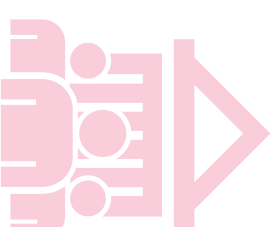

11. Increased engagement opportunities and capacities for the participation in decision-making of CSOs, women, youth, children, people in minorities and people in vulnerable situations
12. Enhanced infrastructure measures for access of persons with disabilities to all services and spheres of life
13. Strengthened capacities for the prevention of the closing of civic space and for countering violations of freedom of assembly and association
14. Strengthened capacities for the promotion of freedom of expression, media freedom and pluralism online, combating hate speech, extremism and disinformation
15. Enhanced awareness and advocacy capacities for the promotion of cultural rights, cultural heritage and cultural diversity
16. Strengthened regulatory capacities and measures addressing access to social services, quality and affordable health services and education
17. Strengthened capacities for the protection of labour rights and promotion of decent work
18. Strengthened human rights networks and opportunities for partnerships created among state actors, international and regional organisations, NHHRs and CSOs
19. Enhanced capacities of State actors for developing, evaluating and implementing regulatory frameworks for digital environments and Artificial Intelligence that respect human rights
20. Increased capacities for the unrestricted access and use of new technologies by all

## Global Europe Results Framework (GERF) indicators

The indicators selected to measure results in this sector include the relevant indicators from the EU Results Framework (INTPA's corporate reporting tool). This framework was created in 2015 to focus attention on results. Since 2018, it aligns with the 2030 Agenda and the EU Consensus on Development. This framework has been updated in 2021 to align with the:

- 2020-24 Strategic Plans for INTPA, NEAR and FPI;
- **2021-27 Multi-Annual Financial Framework**, which includes Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument - Global Europe.

This newly updated framework is called the **Global Europe Results Framework (GERF)**. The GERF has 3 levels of indicators, which correspond to the different levels of a results chain:

- Level 3 is composed of financial indicators,
- Level 2 output and outcome indicators, and
- Level 1 impact indicators.

The sector-specific results chains include relevant indicators from Levels 1 and 2. Level 2 measures results achieved with EU support, so there is a direct link between the intervention and the value taken by the indicator. Level 1 monitors impact using SDG and similar indicators which measure the state of affairs in a given sector, so there is no direct link between the EU-funded intervention and the value taken by the indicator.

Most of the EURF indicators have been maintained in the GERF list. This is the case on human rights. The main revision is the inclusion of additional indicators to monitor new strategic priorities such as digitalisation. These GERF indicators lie at the center of the new monitoring system and are complemented by the thematic indicators proposed in the **sector-specific results chains**.
