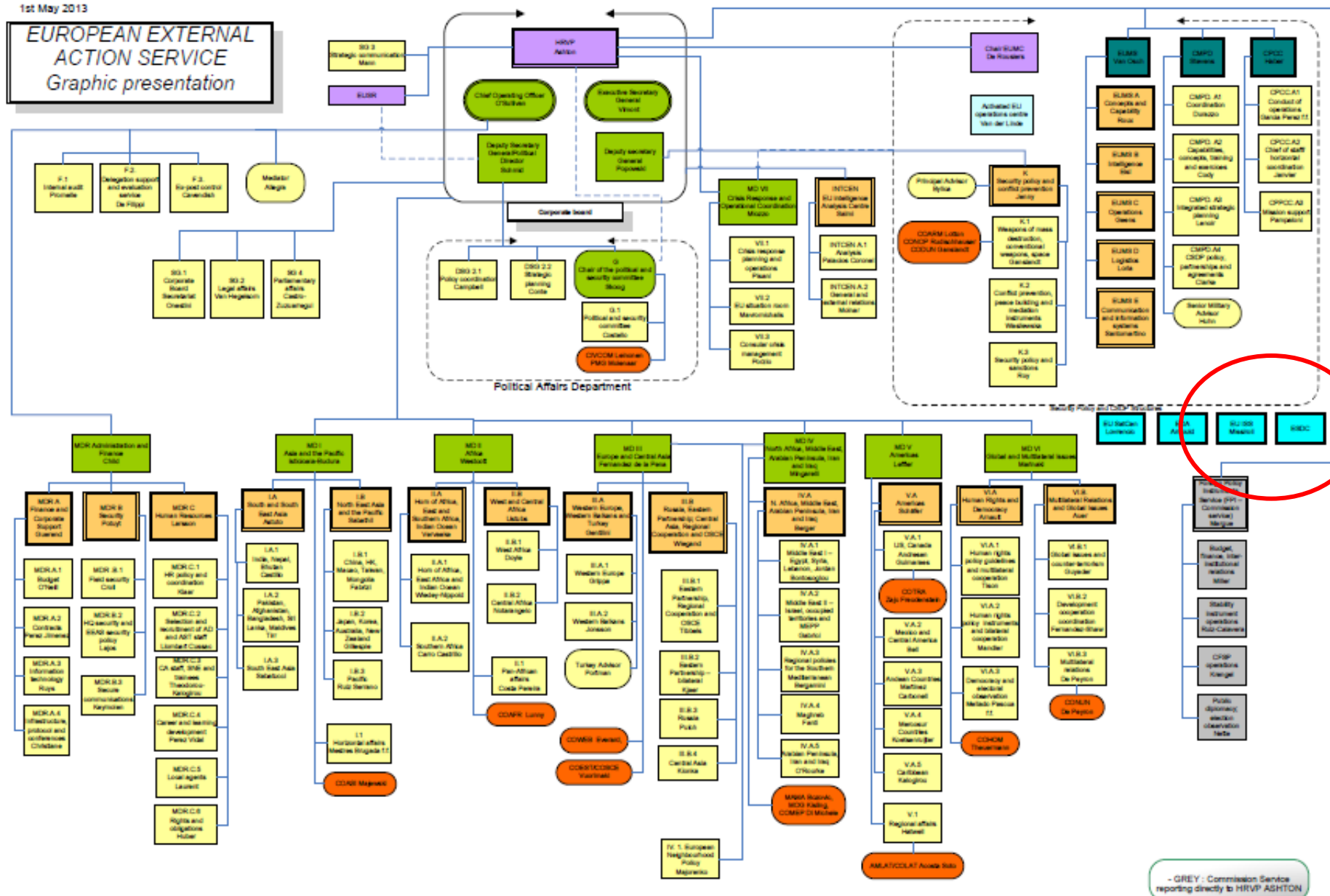

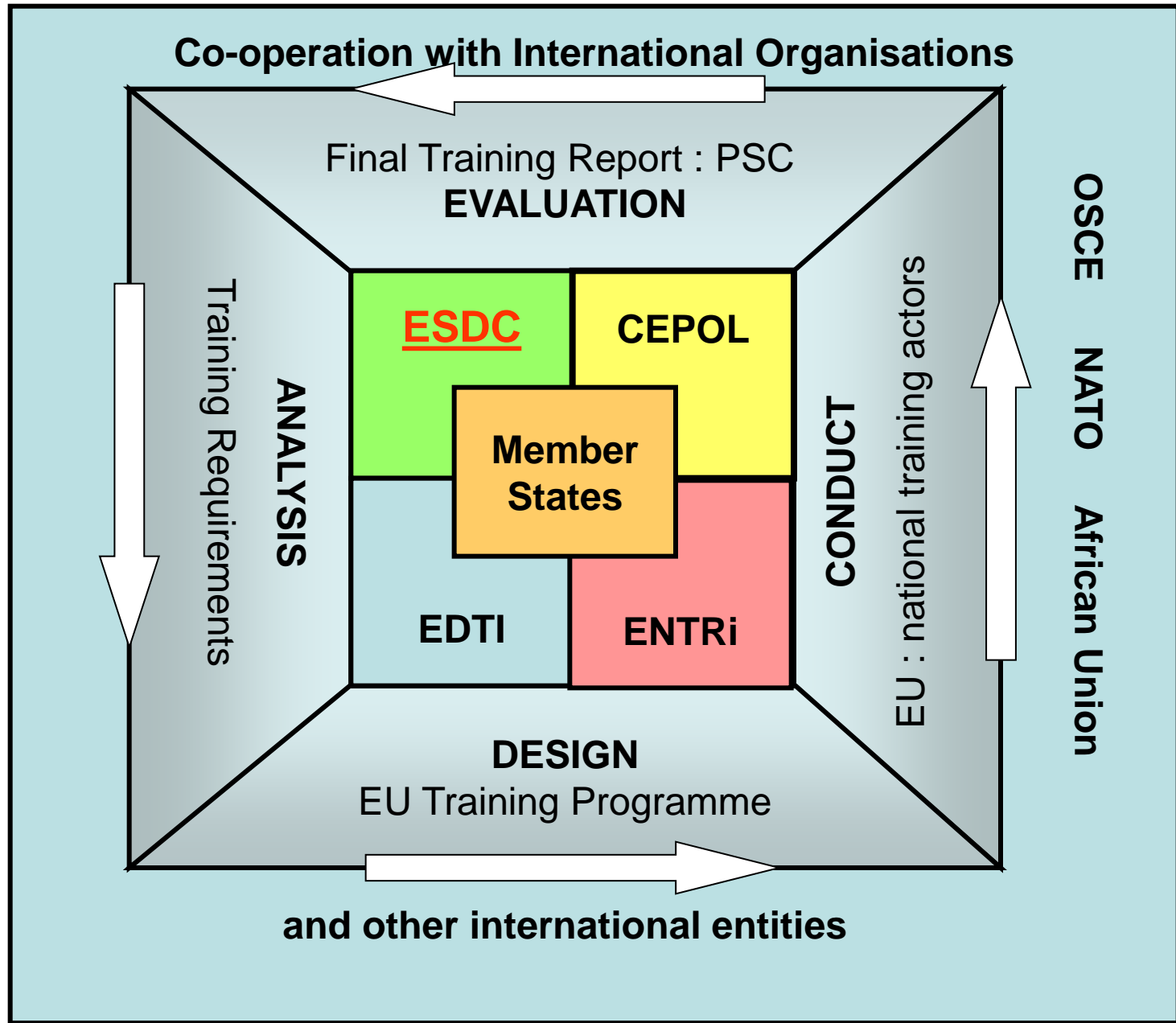

- **help to promote professional relations and contacts among training participants**

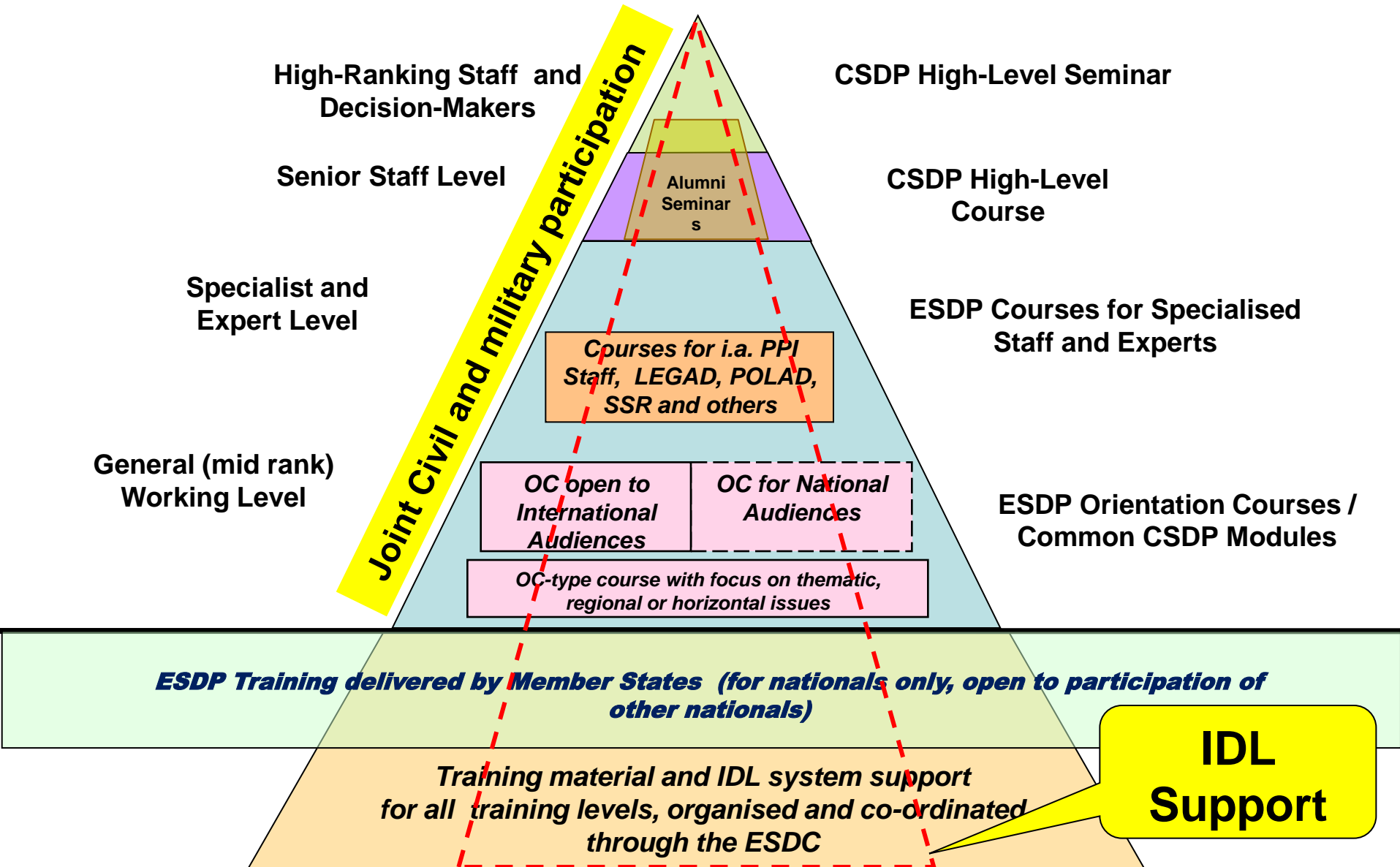

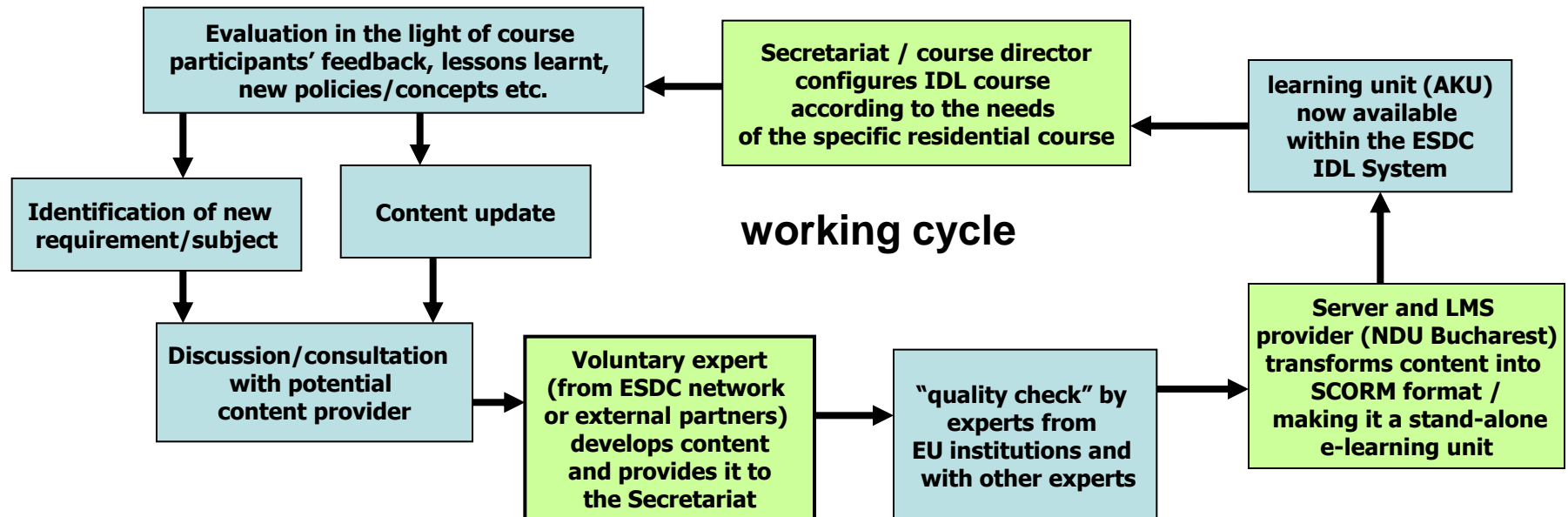

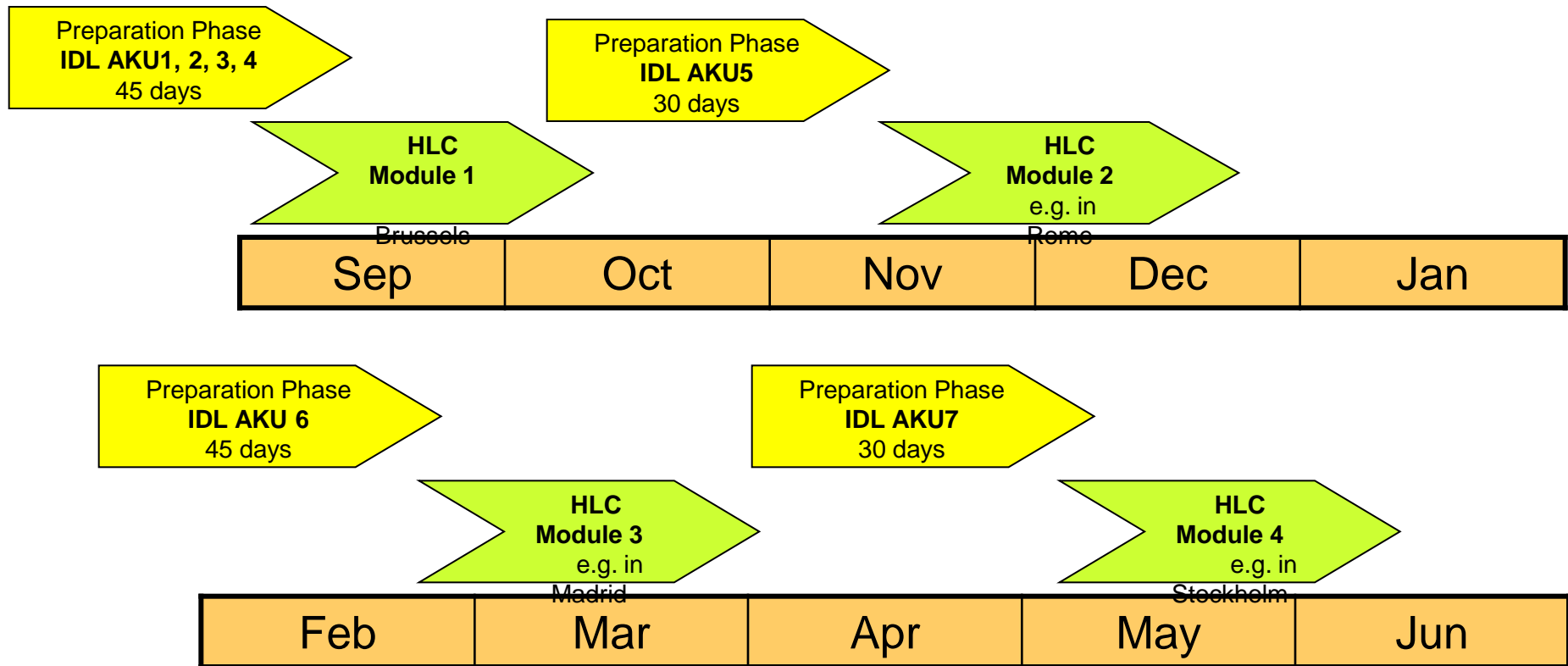

Example: CSDP High Level Course



The CSDP High Level Course is a modular course currently comprising 4 one-week modules taking place in Brussels and at the location of other national civilian and military institutes of Member States. Course participants are senior civilian and military personnel working in key functions in the field of CSDP.

ESDC – Training Record

- Since its creation in 2005, the ESDC has trained approximately 5500 civilian and military participants, coming from the 27 MS, candidate states and EU institutions
- Many courses are open for participation of third states and international organisations (so far ~400 participants)
- Current training capacity: to train ~ 1200 civilian and military in more than 30 training courses every year

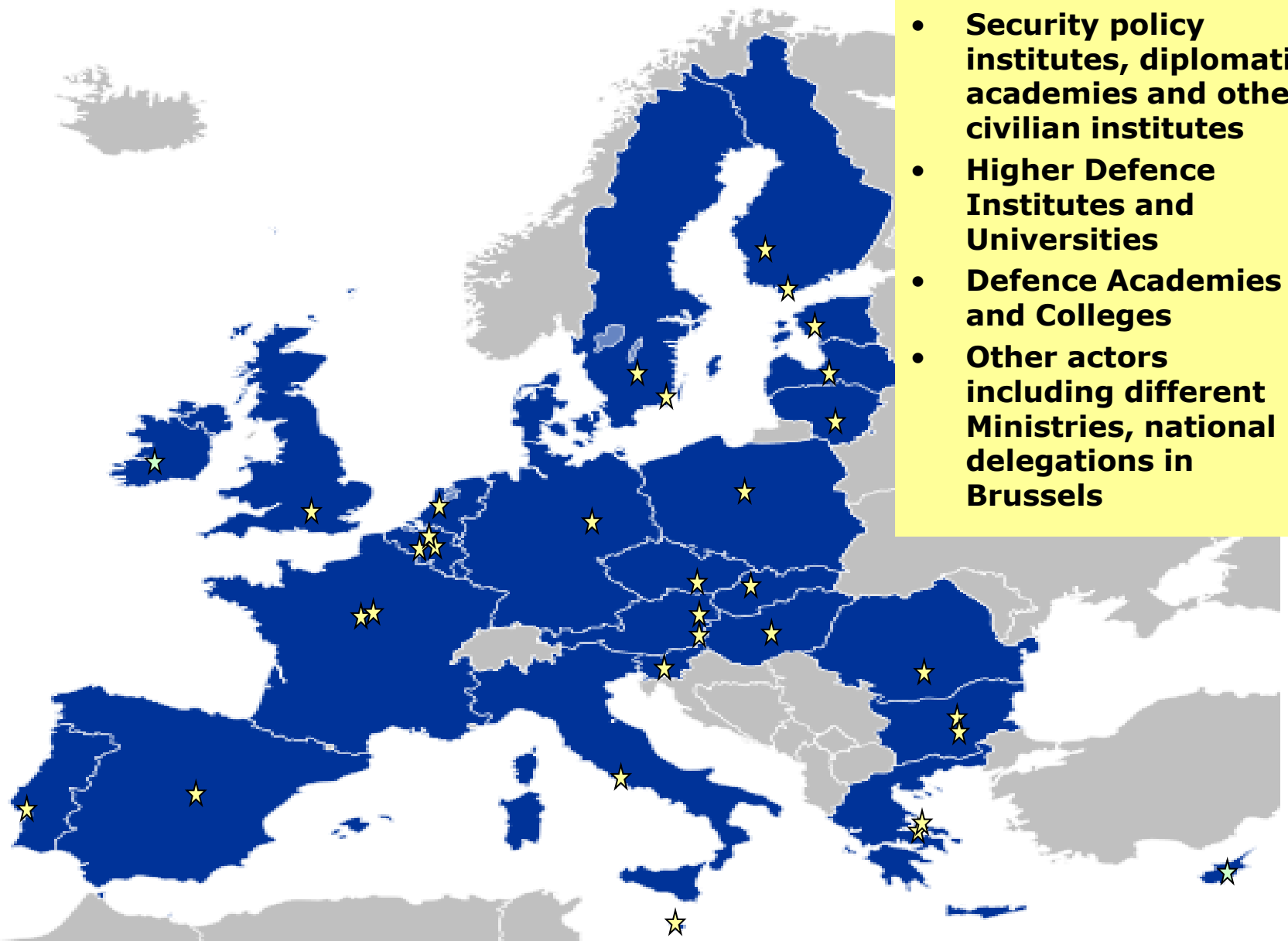

- supports conceptual work

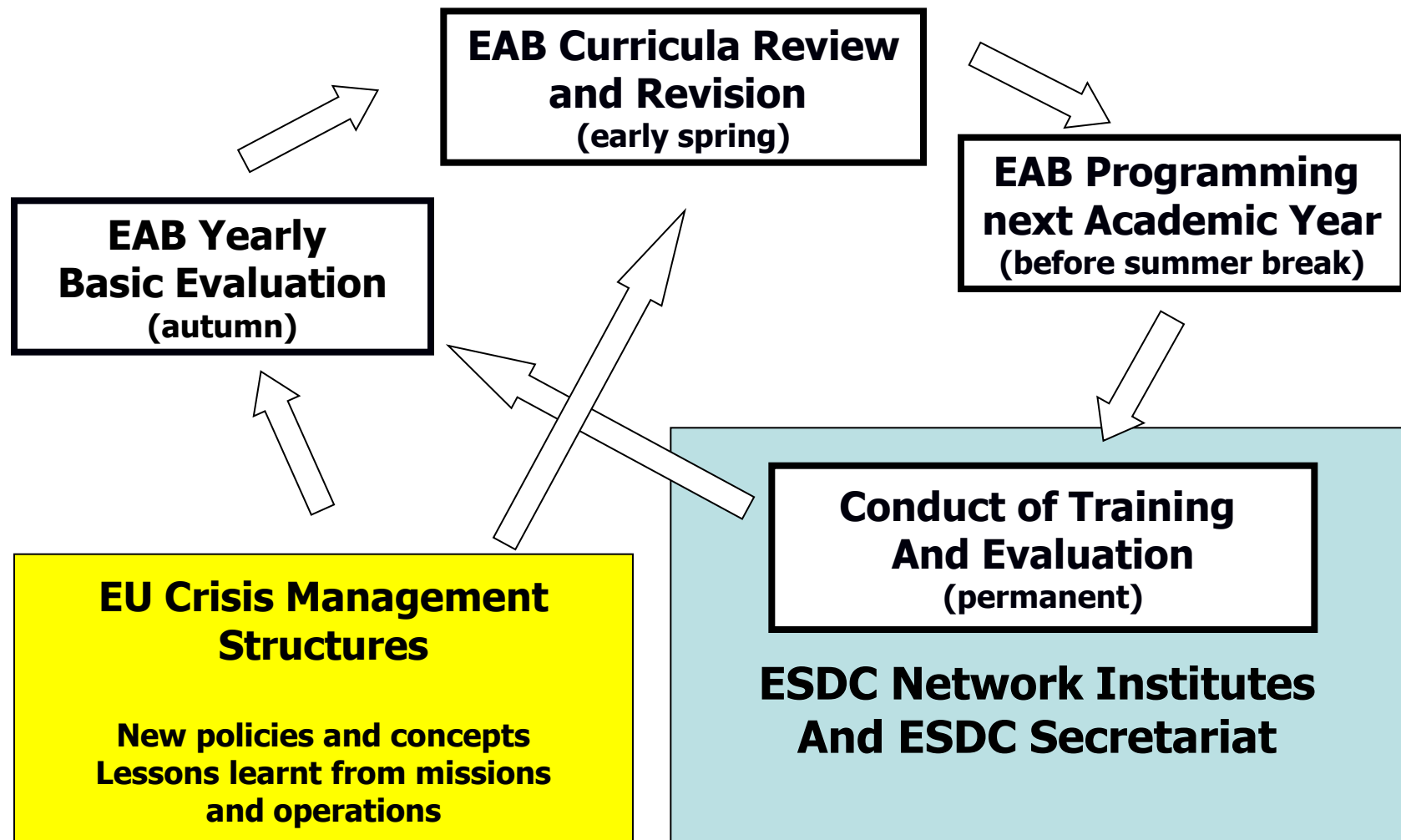

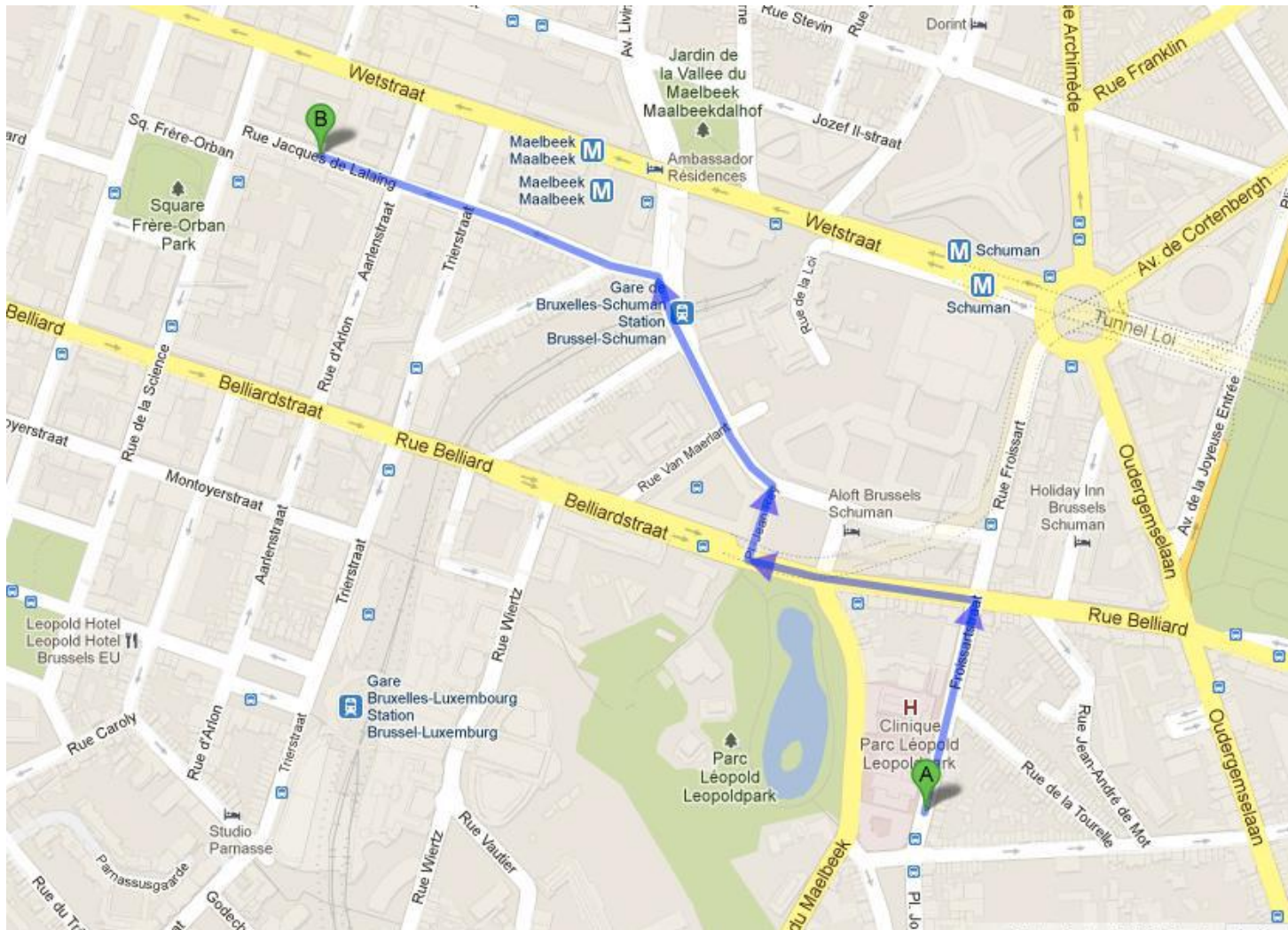
