Informing the International Climate Debate

Brussels, 18-20 September 2013

The GCCA's second global annual event is expected to bring together development and climate practitioners with those responsible for negotiating international agreements in the context of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). Our aim is to inform the international climate debate by linking development and climate practitioners with negotiators on issues of common interest ahead of the next Conference of the Parties, when the 195 Parties to the UNFCCC will meet.

The 2013 Global Policy Event aims to

- Extract lessons learned from the GCCA experience on topics relevant to current negotiations
- Promote dialogue and exchange between practitioners and negotiators involved in the UNFCCC and related processes, with a view to informing the next Conference of the Parties

Delegates will come from the many GCCA partner countries, lead development partners, and European Union Member States, and include both development and climate practitioners and negotiators.

Participants will also include representatives from regional organisations involved in the GCCA, the African Caribbean Pacific Secretariat and EU Delegations.

The discussions will be informed by a series of the background documents. Key note speakers and facilitators will include international climate and development experts from the development community and think tanks, high-level representatives from Least Developed Countries (LDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS), and the European Commission. The event will be held in English and French, with simultaneous interpretation.

The Global Policy Event will explore topics that are of critical importance to both climate negotiators and practitioners:

The GCCA comprises 45 programmes in 35 countries and across 8 regions and sub-regions within an envelope of € 290 million. The GCCA provides a wealth of experience and knowledge in the areas of climate change mainstreaming into national development processes, climate change adaptation and disaster risk reduction (DRR), sustainable land management and Reducing Emissions from Deforestation and Forest Degradation (REDD+), climate finance and aid effectiveness, and institutional strengthening for addressing climate change. As experience grows across the globe, it is critical that the GCCA ensures that the knowledge generated from its implementation informs the international climate debate.
