What are the unique strength of PEP?

- PEP is the informal network.
 - Participants can bring together the experiences
 - Good space where participants tell “truth” with their own capacity
 - Collection of voices from varieties of participants
 - Each member has own resources → host the meetings /implement the projects within their own capacity

What are the most effective way which PEP can provide value added?

- “Providing evidence” receives support
 - GE is relatively new idea
 - Further information on finance, best practices, capacity needs for planning and implementation
 - Highlight on win-win
 - Trade-offs still existing between poverty – environment. → Further evidences (and good human stories) are needed to fill the gap – call for win-win
 - Need to create evidences – sector specific evidences; evidences for private sector involvement; evidence from MDGs implementation
 - Necessary conditions/enabling environment for the success of GE

Where and how can PEP provide evidence on the poverty and environment links?

- PEP can provide evidences to every level of activities (from Macro to micro level)
 - Need to address requirement of audience
 - agenda setting/ tough questions
 - Highlight to fill the gap
 - Learning from implementation of MDGs
 - How does “evidence” contribute to progress to achieve MDGs
