

# Social and Solidarity Economy (SSE)

- Alternative forms of production, finance, exchange and consumption that:
  - give priority to social (and often environmental) objectives
  - promote 'active citizenship' and democratic practices within the economy and polity
  - are based in values and practices of cooperation and solidarity
- Examples include: cooperatives, mutual associations; new forms of community-based or social enterprise, entrepreneurship and service-delivery NGOs; women's self-help groups, community forestry institutions, fair trade networks, associations of informal economy workers, solidarity finance schemes.
