Taking PEFA to new heights: the upgraded PEFA indicator set

#### COURSE OVERVIEW

The PEFA Assessment Framework was extensively upgraded during 2013 & 2014, introducing new indicators and significantly revising many others. This new indicator set is now undergoing final field testing and is expected to be introduced later in 2015.

This course provides a detailed introduction to the testing version of the upgraded PEFA explaining framework, changes made <u>and</u> rationale and outlining the data requirements for their assessment. It will equip PFM specialists to apply the new framework (including upgraded Performance Report), and to interpret its results for PFM reform design. provide an opportunity for direct interaction PEFA Secretariat by videoconference.
