## Many African birds are threatened


Africa is rich in birds; **2,355** species occurring across the continent

**10%** of all African birds are globally threatened; more are becoming so every year

> 40% of migratory birds are declining; nearly 200 are globally threatened

#### Threats to migrants:

- Habitat destruction and degradation
- Illegal hunting, poisoning and pollution
- Collisions with badly-sited infrastructure like power lines and wind farms





## Bird conservation supports wider biodiversity

**Monitoring**: Bird population status provides a good indication of overall ecosystem health

**Site conservation**: IBAs significantly overlap with distributions of other wildlife: 87% for mammals (including 79% globally threatened species); 76% for amphibians

**Policy mainstreaming**: the vast majority of the policies we need to support birds – such as retention of trees in the landscape – also support many other species and habitats

**Ecosystem services**: birds and their habitats provide services, e.g. seed dispersal, soil conservation, carbon storage, water regulation and quality



# Bird conservation is linked to sustainable development

#### Living on the edge project

- Burkina Faso, Mauritania, Senegal and Nigeria
- An approach that combines conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, including that of migratory birds and their habitats, while promoting livelihoods, poverty alleviation and increased food **security** in the Sahel.



















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# Creating sustainable livelihoods impacts

#### Living on the edge project

- Sustainable fish harvesting and fish farming to reduce hunting of migratory birds, improve diets and increase incomes.
- Protection of arable land and promotion of efficient agriculture.
- Efficient use of fuel wood through energy saving stoves reduced desertification, respiratory diseases reduced, more time for economic activities.



# Migratory birds programme aims

- Save flagship globally threatened migratory species
- To address landscape-scale barriers to migration
- To conserve networks of critical stop-over sites, through Local Conservation Groups
- To build capacity for flyway-scale conservation
- To understand and address the wider land-use issues facing migratory birds

We also have eight other global programmes, including Preventing Extinctions and Local Empowerment.

# BirdLife recommendations for the African Wildlife Conservation Strategy

- Tackle indirect threats, including habitat loss and inappropriate foreign investment, which will support conservation of all wildlife
- Create a strong link between conservation and sustainable livelihoods, so that communities benefit from conservation
- Align the strategy with the Multilateral Environmental Agreements, to build on their experience and activities
- Align relevant EU policies and activities with the strategy, to ensure cost-effective, joined-up European action for wildlife in Africa
