


1. Monitoring for effectiveness

- Monitoring as management/governance tool
 - Problem focused
 - Multiple actors + partners
 - Emphasis on validity (triangulation)
 - Use of monitoring information at the lowest relevant levels

2. Quantified participatory monitoring


A flexible system to capture and manage qualitative and quantitative information ...


- ...which can be tailored to suit local conditions

- ...for management in districts and communities







