TEAM EUROPE PROPOSAL



EU contribution: 75 M EUR & TE Members: up to 25 M EUR (indicative)
Enhance the quality of life through:

- Investments in green infrastructure
- Local economic growth and circular economy
- E-governance for local authorities

Urban resilience (30 M EUR - FR, DE, EIB, NL)

- Strengthen resilience planning
- Establishment of the Tanga Water fund and its equivalent in Mwanza
- Improvement of Solid Waste Management in Tanga, Mwanza and Pemba
- Design and transaction costs of PPSs
- Improve social facilities, local markets and basic services to poor urban communities in Pemba

Sustainable local economy (15 M EUR, DE, SE)

- Public Private Dialogue incl. capacity building and organisation of investor forums
- Value chains strengthening - improved vocational skills development
- Professionalization of local businesses and capacity strengthening of financial service providers

Urban policy environment (30 M EUR, DE):

- Deployment of legal and regulatory framework on fiscal decentralization
- Development of e-governance and e-services
- Budget allocation and financing of local urban development plans
- Definition of local strategic development vision
- Planning and management of local development projects
- Joint monitoring of implementation of policy and strategies at central and local levels

KEY DELIVERABLES

- Circular economy**
1. Water Supply and Sanitation plants.

4. BRT bus rapid transit Dar es Salaam - financing of phase 6 of BRT (discussions ongoing with EIB).

TRANSFORMATIONAL POTENTIAL

- The quality of life for inhabitants – women and youth – in the cities of Mwanza, Tanga and Pemba, is improved
- Inclusive and sustainable urban development: green infrastructure, disaster risk reduction and preparedness, local economic development, improved public service delivery and e-governance

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NATIONAL CONTEXT

Fast urban growth (from 54 mln to expected 74 mln in 2030), population bulge and rural urban migration result in unplanned and uncoordinated urban expansion and multi-sectoral challenges

High levels of poverty and unemployment, particularly amongst the youth and women (1/4 living below poverty line)

Major infrastructure gaps

- Low road network density
- Poor access to water and sanitation
