TRANSFORMATIONAL POTENTIAL

- The quality of life for inhabitants women and youth in the cities of Mwanza, Tanga and Pemba, is improved
- <u>Inclusive and sustainable urban development</u>: green infrastructure, disaster risk reduction and preparedness, local economic development, improved public service delivery and e-governance

- Establishment of the Tanga Water fund and its equivalent in Mwanza
- Improvement of Solid Waste Management in Tanga, Mwanza and Pemba
- Design and transaction costs of PPSs
- Improve social facilities, local markets and basic services to poor urban communities in Pemba





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Fast urban growth (from 54 mln to expected 74 mln in 2030), population bulge and rural urban migration result in unplanned and uncoordinated urban expansion and multisectoral challenges High levels of poverty and unemployment, particularly amongst the youth and women (1/4 living below poverty line)


Major infrastructure gaps
