Curbing unsustainable demographic growth

Harnessing remaining opportunities for a real demographic dividend

Impact on:

- People's livelihoods, fulfilment of their human rights
- Environmental sustainability (planned urbanisation, disaster risk reduction)

Support critical sectors such as:

- Education, to bring higher school completion rates (importantly for girls)
- Health, (financial) access to quality SRHR services, including family planning
- Social protection, to reduce risks of falling back into extreme poverty and all its consequences

Assist Uganda in customizing tailor-made (sub)regional responses

Address existing narratives on gender roles and demography & culturally sensitive topics:

- Cooperation with the Government and patnerships with the civil society
- Building and scaling block-chain solutions for more transparent and accountable social investments

KEY DELIVERABLES

To date the below has been achieved. This action will be scaled up, with a stronger emphasis on education for adolescent girls.

- 1. Close to 5 million people reached with messages challenging prevalent negative social norms,
- 2. 2,600 victims accessing legal aid clinics and essential services,
- 3. 430 community, religious and cultural leaders making commitments of ending violence against women and girls
- 4. Close to 100 private companies reinforcing gender equality at work,
- 5. 2,000 adolescent girls benefiting from SRHR services, improved safety in refugee centers through street ligthing and call centers and training of police officers.

Going forward, it will:

- Construction of Wash facilities in schools
- 2000 adolescent girls benefitting from access to SRHR services
- · Scholarships for girls in vulnerable communities
- Policy implementation and awareness raising on SGBV
- Supporting Uganda First Lady's campaign "Protect the girl, save the nation"

TRANSFORMATIONAL POTENTIAL

- Reposition social investment in the national agenda
- A strengthened and inclusive human development policy-, investment-, dialogue- and accountability framework

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NATIONAL CONTEXT

Situation:

- Sustainable development threaten by:
 - Exponential population growth
 - Insufficient investment in people
- Food insecurity and undernutrition

75% of the population is less than 30 years old

Low secondary education completion rates, especially girls:

- Very few options outside of the informal
- Sector or subsistence farming on agricultural plots

Child labour

Low availability of Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) services

High total fertility rate (5.4)

Doubling of the current population within the next 25 years

- Significant challenges for social services and employment
- Huge implications on the support ratio between the working and dependent populations
- Significant reduction in the budget allocated to the education sector between 2003 and 2020

Gender-based violence & violence against children

- Land conflicts:
 - 。 Inequalities & poverty among regions
 - 。 Refugees (85% of the 1.4 million refugees in Uganda are women and children)
- · Access to basic services prevented by:
 - High cost of health services & pharmaceuticals
 - 。 Lack of inputs, equipment and staffing in
 - 。Health centres
