TRANSFORMATIONAL POTENTIAL

- Environmental sustainability in Argentina's socio-economic development model
- Enabling environment for sustainable investments
- Environmentally sustainable and socially inclusive economic recovery

KEY DELIVERABLES

Circular economy

- Improving Waste Management by closing open air dump sites plastic recycling (Par Patagonico). Biodiversity and promotion of sustainable development
- 2. Development of Gran Chaco through a comprehensive approach including scientific cooperation (France), cultural and comercial cooperation (Italy), and specific activities such as apiculture (Slovenia), support to indigenous people (Ireland), water & sanitation (The Netherlands) and forestry (Germany and Finland).

Renewable energy

- 3. Support to SMEs that lead investments in the areas of sustainable energy (mainly energy efficiency and renewable energy) and bio-economy (green multibeneficiary intermediated loan (MBIL) for EUR 60 million to be implemented by the state-owned Banco de Inversion y Comercio Exterior (BICE)).
- Expansion and modernisation of the electricity transmission network covering 23 provinces nationwide (FRamework loanwith EIB of EUR 100m).
- 5. Commercialization of green low-carbon technologies of European small and medium-sized enterprises and companies in Argentina, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia and Mexico (DG GROW, FPI); Food production value chains
- 6. Resilient food production in horticulture-livestock systems for Family Farming in climatically vulnerable regions of Argentina and Colombia. This is related to the Gran Chaco Initiative (see point 2).
