





## **Forest Partnership**

between the European Union and Mongolia

**Conclusions of the first Political Working Group** 

### I. Introduction

The European Union (EU) and Mongolia, hereinafter 'the Partners' concluded in November 2022 a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for a Forest Partnership (Forest Partnership). The Forest Partnership reflects their shared responsibility in relation to the challenges posed to forests by climate change and development needs. Through a holistic and integrated approach to forests, implemented on the basis of formal strategic dialogue and policy cooperation, the partners will propagate their shared aspiration to enable forests to fulfil their economic, social and environmental role. The overall aim is to enhance the role of Mongolian forests in sustainable and inclusive national development, and to address challenges related to deforestation, desertification, land degradation, climate change and loss of biodiversity.

In order to operationalize the MoU, the Partners developed a **Roadmap**, and instituted a **Technical and a Political Working Group**.

### II. Targets

As set out in the Roadmap under 'General', the Partners will develop a set of baselines and targets to monitor the progress towards the identified milestones and ultimately the objectives of the MoU. Additionally, it can be utilised to steer action towards the achievement of the objectives in the MoU, as well as facilitate the mobilization of appropriate resources and attract the necessary investments.

### III. The Roadmap

With the specific objectives laid out in the MoU, the Partners agreed to develop a Roadmap, structured around the four key workstreams of the Partnership with concrete **actions**, **milestones** and **associated responsibilities** being identified at this stage to allow for a full exploration of investment opportunities in the course of implementation. The special role of **investments** in rolling out the workstreams towards achieving the objectives is highlighted as is the pertinence of international climate finance. The Roadmap is included in <u>Annex I</u>.

The Roadmap was developed **jointly** by the Partners (and in consultation with relevant stakeholders) in the period following the signing of the MoU. It was **reviewed** by the Technical Working Group during its meeting on 9 June 2023 and additional feedback has been taken on board.

This Roadmap represents the **operational arm** of the Forest Partnership with the purpose of advancing its vision and deliver development impact for Mongolia in line with its Vision 2050 and Billion Tree Movement. The Roadmap is firmly anchored in the Team Europe approach and further underpinned by strategic EU initiatives including the European Green Deal and the Global Gateway.

The Roadmap is a **living document** which will be regularly reviewed to ensure its effectiveness, efficiency, feasibility and implementability. The Political Working Group will guide and steer its implementation and address proposals by the Technical Working Group towards the fulfilment of the aims and objectives of the Forest Partnership. The Technical Working Group will monitor and evaluate progress, identify opportunities for additional actions and investments as well as options to tackle challenges and mitigate unintended consequences.

### IV. Working Groups

In the context of the development of the Roadmap, the **compositions of the Political Working Group** and **Technical Working Group** were agreed between the Partners. The Political Working Group is to be co-chaired by the Minister of Environment and Tourism and the Head of the EU Delegation to Mongolia. The Technical Working Group is to be co-chaired by the Director General of the National Forest Agency and the Head of Cooperation of the EU Delegation. Both include representation from relevant Ministries as well as EU Member States (<u>Annex II</u>). The Partners also agreed on the Terms of Reference for the Working Groups (<u>Annex II</u>).

### Annex III - Terms of Reference of Working Groups

# TERMS of REFERENCE of the POLITICAL WORKING GROUP and the TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP of the Forest Partnership between the European Union and Mongolia

### Role and responsibilities

- 1. The Political Working Group, hereinafter "PWG", established pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding on a Forest Partnership between the European Union and Mongolia, hereinafter "Forest Partnership", will oversee the management and implementation of the Forest Partnership and ensure the effective dialogue and cooperation between the EU and Mongolia, hereinafter "the Partners" in this context.
- 2. The PWG will guide and steer the implementation of the Roadmap, monitor progress and achievements, and address challenges to and opportunities for the fulfilment of the objectives of the Forest Partnership.
- 3. The PWG will address any issues that may arise in relation to the interpretation and implementation of the Forest Partnership and facilitate their resolution in good faith and in accordance with the context, purpose and objectives of the Forest Partnership.

### Chairmanship

- 4. The PWG will meet at least twice a year.
- 5. The PWG will be jointly chaired by the Minister of Environment and Tourism of Mongolia and the Head of the EU Delegation to Mongolia. The Chairpersons may arrange to be represented by designees who will exercise all their rights.

### **Technical Working Group**

- 6. The PWG will be assisted by a Technical Working Group, hereinafter "TWG".
- 7. The TWG will be chaired jointly by the Director General of the National Forest Agency and the Head of Cooperation of the EU Delegation to Mongolia.
- 8. The TWG shall prepare the meetings and the deliberations of the PWG, supervise and coordinate the implementation of the actions agreed by the PWG, consider any matter referred to it by the PWG as well as any other matter which may arise in the course of the day-to-day implementation of the Forest Partnership.
- 9. The TWG will meet on a quarterly basis and at minimum prior to the PWG meetings.

### **Transparency**

**10.** The PWG and the TWG will ensure that their work is transparent and that all relevant information about its work is made available to the public.

### Representation

**11.** The Partners have agreed to the composition of the PWG and TWG, reflected in the Decree issued by the Minister of Environment and Tourism, co-chair of the PWG, dated 10 March 2023, Ref No. A/59, and may be altered following the agreement hereto by the Partners.

### Official communications

**12.** The representatives of the Partners responsible for official communications concerning the implementation of the Forest Partnership and all dialogue and cooperation in this context, including in relation to the PWG and the TWG will be:

For Mongolia: Director General of the National Forest Agency

For the European Union: the Head of the Cooperation of the EU Delegation to Mongolia.

### **Meetings**

- 13. The meetings of the PWG or TWG may be held physically or by videoconference.
- **14.** A provisional agenda for each meeting shall be drawn up jointly by the Partners and agreed by the Chairpersons.
- **15.** The agenda will be adopted by the PWG or TWG at the beginning of each meeting. Items other than those appearing on the provisional agenda may be included if the Partners agree.
- **16.** Draft minutes of each meeting shall be drawn up jointly by the Partners or as designated by them. The minutes shall be approved by the Partners at the end of the meeting under the title "Aide-Memoire".
- 17. Unless otherwise decided, the meetings of the PWG or TWG will not be public.
- **18.** Information or documents considered as confidential under national laws and regulations of a Partner will be treated as confidential.

### **Participation**

**19.** The Chairpersons of the PWG or the TWG may agree to invite to their respective meetings where appropriate, private sector actors, social/non-state partners, local communities, indigenous peoples, youth, women, international public organisations, experts, interested financial institutions, academia, research institutions and/or donors.

### **Facilitation**

**20.** The Partners will agree on the need, role and responsibilities of a Facilitator to accompany the implementation of the Forest Partnership and the functioning of the PWG and TWG.

### **Expenses**

**21.** Each Partner will meet any expenses it incurs as a result of participating in the meetings of the PWG or TWG.
