The graph presents Team Europe's total use of the multilateral system, i.e. both heir multilateral aid ("Core contributions to") and their bilateral aid channelled hrough ("Contributions through") multilateral organisations. "Core contributions of are resources transferred to multilateral organisations that the governing poards of these organisations have the unqualified right to allocate as they see fit within the limits prescribed by the organisations mandate. Bilateral funds mplemented by multilaterals ("Contributions through") are resources channelled hrough multilateral organisations over which the donor retains some degree of control on decisions regarding disposal of the funds; such flows may be
