D4D Hub is a multi-layered coordination mechanism that operates through:

- 1. Global D4D Hub Board at global level.
- 2. Regional Branches at regional and *national* level:
 - Africa (launched in December 2020).
 - Latin America and Caribbean (launched in December 2021).
 - Asia Pacific (launched in February 2022).
- 3. 10 Thematic working groups as part of the mechanism

Global Board and Regional branches jointly take strategic and political orientations, as:

- The Board provides the political steering and meets at least twice a year ().
- The Secretariat carries out the day-to-day activities of the Global D4D hub.
- Regional branches support the strategic partnerships between European and local stakeholders in key regions and countries while contributing to ensuring coordination at regional and local level.
- Thematic working groups and advisory groups.

10 fully operational Thematic working groups (each is co-led by DG INTPA and 1 or 2 MS):

- 1. Digital & Green Twin Transition,
- 2. Entrepreneurship & Innovation,
- 3. Digital Governance,
- 4. Digital Literacy and Skills,
- 5. Digital Connectivity,
- 6. Gender and Digital Rights,
- 7. Space and Earth Observation,
- 8. Cybersecurity,
- 9. Digital Health,
- 10. Artificial Intelligence.

D4D HUB

The Hub facilitates, through dialogue, the identification of new joint initiatives (in line with the Team Europe approach) in partner countries to scale up investments and innovation, while promoting a humancentric approach to digitalisation.

D4D Hub is a platform open to all EU MS:

- At today gathers 14 EU MSs: BE, DE, EE, ES, FI, FR, LT, LU, NL, PT, SE, SI.
- Ensures engagements, coordination <u>and</u> <u>harmonisation of actions</u>, and synergies among the EU, MSs, their development agencies and IFIs.
- Ensure a multi-stakeholder approach involving private sector, civil society, and academia via the Advisory Groups.

Multi-Partner Contribution Agreement (MPCA):

- 4 MS agencies will implement and co-finance the MPCA and be acting in the interest of all MS involved in the Hub.
- DG INTPA will co-fund from the Global Challenges Programme.
