HOW DO WE SUPPORT CIVIL SOCIETY IN NEPAL? The EU ROADMAP FOR ENGAGEMENT WITH CIVIL SOCIETY IN NEPAL (2021–2024)

WHAT IS THE ROADMAP?

The EU believes that supporting the development of a pluralistic and vibrant civil society is key in devising policies that meet people's needs; increase awareness and citizens' engagement around global challenges and on all three dimensions of sustainable development (economic, social and environmental), both within and outside the EU. Civil society is vital to fight inequalities to build inclusive societies, and, thereby fulfil the central commitment of the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development of leaving no one behind.

In a context in which there is a trend towards a more restrictive environment for civil society worldwide (which has been aggravated by the COVID-19 crisis), the EU attaches particular importance to promoting a more conducive space for civil society while supporting civil society capacities to operate and its participation in the public policy cycle.

This Roadmap expresses the EU's and its Member States' commitment to civil society in the design and execution of their country strategies and development programmes, as well as in ensuring that civil society voices are reflected in the political dialogue that the EU has with the national authorities. This Roadmap is part of "Team Europe", a joint initiative by the EU and Member States.

In Nepal, the Roadmap for Civil Society acknowledges the increasing challenges and complexity of the environment civil society is operating in, and envisages the promotion of a more effective dialogue between Civil Society and the Government of Nepal, with clearer modalities for civil society to partner with the Government and International

Development Partners to achieve the SDGs. The Roadmap also recognises the incredible diversity, experience and knowledge of the civil society organisations present in the Country and the promising opportunity that federalism presents, as more cohesive partnerships with Local Governments will result in greater participation of civil society in policy dialogue at the local level.
