These documents are being consulted with the broader membership and the preparations for the first autumn events are underway.

Working Group 2: Progress on Work Plan for 2024 - 2025 to Strengthen Democratic Support

Since June's TED Network meeting, Working Group 2 (WG2) has drafted its 2024-2025 work plan, focusing on operationalising recommendations on inclusive participation and civic space, with a forward-looking approach to local



democratic governance and citizen engagement in-between elections. The plan was presented for adoption at the WG2 meeting on 12 September 2024. It aims to build on past achievements, turn policy into action and align with strategic priorities while fostering collaboration. These documents were consulted with the wider membership and the preparation for the first autumn events is underway.



Working Group 3: Working Plan for 2024 - 2025 Elaborated

Similar to WG1 and WG2 also Working Group 3 (WG3) "Media and Digital" is advancing on its work plan for 2024-2025. Key activities will focus on supporting media and information integrity, aligned with OECD Development Cooperation Principles. Developed with input from the WG3 Coordination Team and members during the TED Network Annual Meeting, the plan includes strategically mapping EU-funded initiatives, conducting thematic reviews, and organising webinars on enhancing information integrity and human rights. The country selection process for specific activities will commence this year, with implementation planned for 2025.

Political Economy Analysis launched in Uganda

TED is supporting the European Union Delegation (EUD) to Uganda in an annual Political Economy Analysis focused on democratic governance, aiming to strengthen the resilience of European support for democracy in Uganda amidst an evolving political landscape. The initiative, which began in May 2024 involving two regional experts, led to the completion and presentation of a desk report in July. Following this, the team embarked on interviews, round tables, and further reporting. The first report is expected in October 2024. Updates to the report are scheduled for September-October 2025 and 2026. The Political Economy Analysis builds on the expertise and stakeholder analysis from TED's initial support in 2023, which involved the preparation of a €15 million Action Document for Advancing Governance and Accountability.

Since the start of the assignment, the team has collaborated with the EUD and Member States in Uganda to identify key issues to be covered. These include the state of the economy, corruption and accountability, separation of powers, succession and transition, shrinking civic space, evolving aid/partnership dynamics and gender equality and inclusion.



Grants

Grants Call for Proposal Launched - Strengthening African Inclusive Participation Research

TED, through Enabel, launched a call for proposals on 15 July 2024 to support research on inclusive participation in Benin, Burkina Faso, Senegal, Niger, Ivory Coast, Mali, Guinea and Mauritania. Two grants of up to €125,000 each are offered, totalling €250,000, to generate insights that will support both African and European actors in informing policies, strengthening partnerships and

promoting peer exchanges in the field of democracy support.

Concept notes were due by 16 August 2024, with shortlisted candidates expected to submit full proposals in September 2024.
