President von der Leyen has been re-elected by the European Council to be President of the European Commission for a second term, alongside Kaja Kallas as High Representative and António Costa as President of the European Council. Over the summer months, President von der Leyen has been busy interviewing candidates and on 17 September <u>unveiled her new team</u> that will make up the College of Commissioners.

On 18 July, President von der Leyen issued her <u>Political Guidelines</u>, which set out her vision for the next five year mandate. The Guidelines focus on advancing a new economic foreign policy by improving competitiveness at home while continuing to deepen free and fair trade links with growth centres and partners around the world. To this end, the EU Guidelines commit to pursuing a reformed and strengthened World Trade Organization, the Indo-Pacific Strategy, and partnerships with Japan, Korea, New Zealand and Australia to face common challenges in cyber, space and in the secure supply of critical minerals technologies. The Political Guidelines, together with Mario Draghi's <u>new report</u> emphasise the importance of boosting the European Union's competitiveness over the next mandate.

Let's take Horizon Europe: as I write, there is a roadshow underway across Auckland, Hamilton, Wellington and Christchurch (we will visit more cities next year).

In Wellington on 21 October, I will host a reception for our Horizon Europe friends – please email/LinkedIn me if you do not yet have an invitation and would like to join us.

It was great to roll up my sleeves and get the gumboots on for the beach clean-up and tree-planting – new ways to get close up, learn and enjoy New Zealand. Looking ahead, in about a year's time, we plan to hold a European Business Summit. A year into implementation of our Free Trade Agreement, it will be a great moment to see how trade has changed and where we can grow new areas. I welcome your ideas on the key sectors for our trade to include and who or which European business you would like to hear at the Summit.

Ambassador Lawrence Meredith offered condolences in person on behalf of the European Union following the passing of Kīngi Tuheitia Pootatau Te Wherowhero VII. At his tangihanga, all paid tribute to the King's life of public service and his gift for bringing people together. Kua hinga he totara i te wao nui a Tane.



As was said on the marae, a mighty totara has fallen, but may it become a waka wide enough for all people of Aotearoa. The EU flew its flag at half-mast to mark the occasion.

European Union features at New Zealand Aerospace Summit 2024



New guidance document on the application of rules of origin under EU-NZ FTA



The EU has published a <u>guidance document</u> to assist NZ importers in taking advantage of tariff savings. This guidance outlines the application of the rules of origin under the EU-NZ Free Trade Agreement, which became effective on 1 May 2024.

According to the Agreement, NZ importers can claim preferential tariffs on EU-originating products if the EU exporter provides a statement of origin for consignments valued over EUR 6,000. To issue this statement, the EU exporter must be registered in the REX system and include their REX number on the document.

EU concludes negotiations with Singapore for Digital Trade Agreement

The EU and Singapore have concluded negotiations for a Digital Trade Agreement (DTA). The deal is the first EU agreement of its kind, reflecting that the EU is a global standard-setter for digital trade rules and cross-border data flows.



The Agreement reflects the strategic importance of digital trade and the pivotal role that Southeast Asia plays given the growth of its digital economy.

Digital Developments

World's first law to regulate Al enters into force

The AI Act is the first-ever legal framework on AI, which addresses the risks of AI and positions Europe to play a leading role globally. European citizens and businesses can now safely and confidently seize the opportunities of secure and trustworthy AI which plays by clear rules:

- Unacceptable risk AI, such as social scoring, is banned.
- High-risk AI, including recruitment and applications in medical devices, must meet strict requirements.
- Limited-risk AI, like chatbots, must inform users they are interacting with AI.
- Minimal risk AI, for example, spam filters, follows existing rules with no additional obligations.
