Objectives

The seminar aims to introduce policy advisors and experts in rural development and natural resource management to concepts and practices in land administration and governance based on scientific research and practical evidence. On an international level, the past 50 years have provided an enormous wealth of examples and experiences in dealing with property rights, land reform and land registration. It has been understood that unlimited exploitation of natural resources and untransparent acquisition of land leads to conflicts, soil degradation and unsustainable land-use practices. The questions to answer therefore will be:

What are the appropriate strategies and systems under prevailing conditions to be set up?

What can we learn from evidence and experience in comparable socio-economic environments?

What are the major decisions and steps need to be taken to ensure sustainable economic growth with due consideration of social wellbeing of a given population and protection of the environment?

- Cadastral systems and land registration
- Dealing with conflicts and differing interests
- Challenges of large scale land acquisition and land reform
