

1. Context



EUD best practices

- EUD Political Advocacy (contribute to workshops, connect with the Minister, PS etc.e.g. Lesotho, Nigeria)
- Further political and possibly financial support to accession processes ie Gambia approached the EU delegation, which supported a national capacity-building event for parliamentarians
- Integration of Water Convention actions with EU investment priorities in climate resilience, environmental governance, and sustainable development
- Facilitation of dialogue with EU member states for technical expertise and twinning opportunities

Achievements

- New countries acceded
- Elevated political commitment to transboundary cooperation
- **Boosted regional cooperation** on transboundary surface and groundwater resources.
- Unlocked donors support in new Parties
- Accelerated knowledge exchange and cooperation with the EU and accession countries

Challenges

 Growing demand for support in implementing the Water Convention


Lessons learnt

- The combination of technical activities and promotion of accession
- Continuous support and advice from the secretariat and strategic collaboration with EUD are needed
- Support regional champions



2. Strategy

- The Senegalo-Mauritanian Aquifer Basin (SMAB) is shared by the Gambia, Guinea Bissau, Mauritania and Senegal
- SMAB countries are over 80% dependent on groundwater resources to satisfy their populations' needs
- **Request by Senegal** as new Party to Water Convention and following 2017 SDG indicator 6.5.2 reporting exercise
- Aquifer under **pressure** from population growth and agriculture, overuse and declining water quality
- have **no** operational arrangements
- Ensuring its **sustainable management is crucial** for the stability of the region and its water security





3. Achievment

2018: Support request of international partners for a cooperation initiative on the SMAB. 2019: Roadmap for the development of a joint vision and of a programme establishing long term cooperation on the basin.

2020-2021: Establishment of a Regional Working Group for Transboundary Cooperation on the SMAB + 5 technical studies Partners: Water Convention (EU Financing); GWH; IGRAC; and since 2022, World Bank, GEF/OSS/UNEP

2021: Ministerial Declaration on the Senegalo-Mauritanian Aquifer Basin signed /Accession by <u>Guinea</u> <u>Bissau</u>

2024-2026: Negotiations on the legal agreement at the RWG meetings



Target to sign an agreement by 2026 Water Conference / EU and Italy partnering to support implementation through TEI



International Peer-to-Peer project implemented by the International Network of Basin Organisations (INBO/ RIOB) and the African Network of Basin Organizations (RAOB)


Strengthen the capacities of basin organisations by facilitating cooperation, expertise sharing, and mutual capacity building in water resources management

Promote EU water management expertise (Water Framework Directive) and/or global frameworks (UNECE Water Convention) if applicable.

INBO is in charge of matching basin organisation peers who will be allocated a sub-grant based on detailed proposals in the following regions: 70% in Africa, 20% in Asia, 10% in LAC.
