

How does this impact your work?

Based on the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights (UNGPs) and the OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises, the EU is developing a regulatory framework that combines mandatory requirements with voluntary support for corporate sustainability. A key example is the CSDDD, which requires companies within its scope to identify, prevent, and mitigate adverse human rights and environmental impacts throughout their value chains.

As the CSDDD and related legislation evolve, it is essential that governments, businesses, and civil society in non-EU countries understand the implications and prepare in time for the upcoming changes. The resources offered by the Navigator assist stakeholders to develop their capacities to mitigate environmental and human rights risks, but also to identify and seize strategic opportunities – such as improved market access or enhanced investment prospects, as well as improved access to remedy for civil society and rightsholders.

The Navigator has been developed under the umbrella of the **Team Europe Initiative** (TEI) "Sustainability in Global Value Chains" and is jointly funded by the European Commission (DG INTPA) and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).
