Framing Question 3. Is
the VC socially
sustainable?

CQ3.1. Are **working conditions** throughout the VC socially acceptable and sustainable? Do VC operations contribute to improving them?

CQ3.2. Are the **land and water rights** implemented throughout the VC socially acceptable and sustainable?

CQ3.3. Throughout the VC, do actors foster and put into practice **gender equality**?

CQ3.4. Do VC operations contribute to upgrading and securing the **food and nutrition conditions**?

CQ3.5. Is **social capital** enhanced by VC operations and equitably distributed throughout the VC?

The social analysis

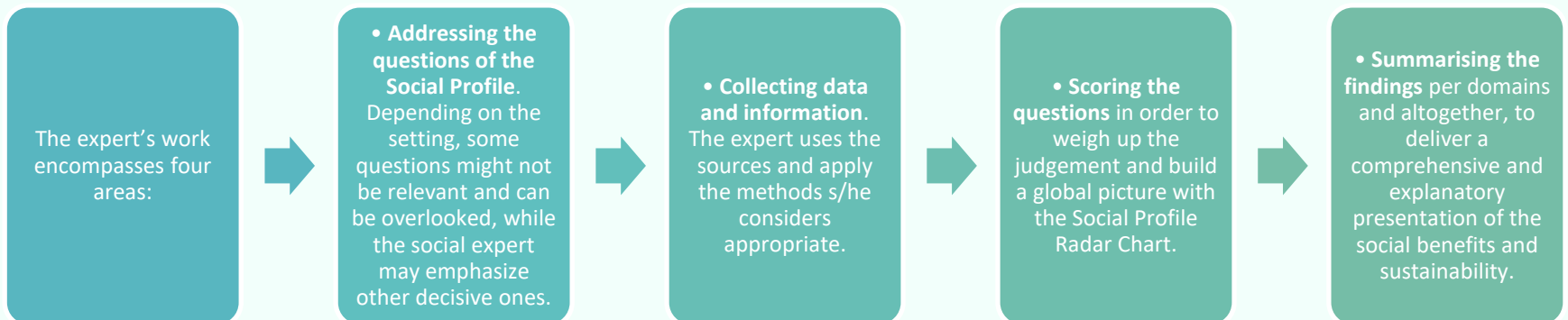
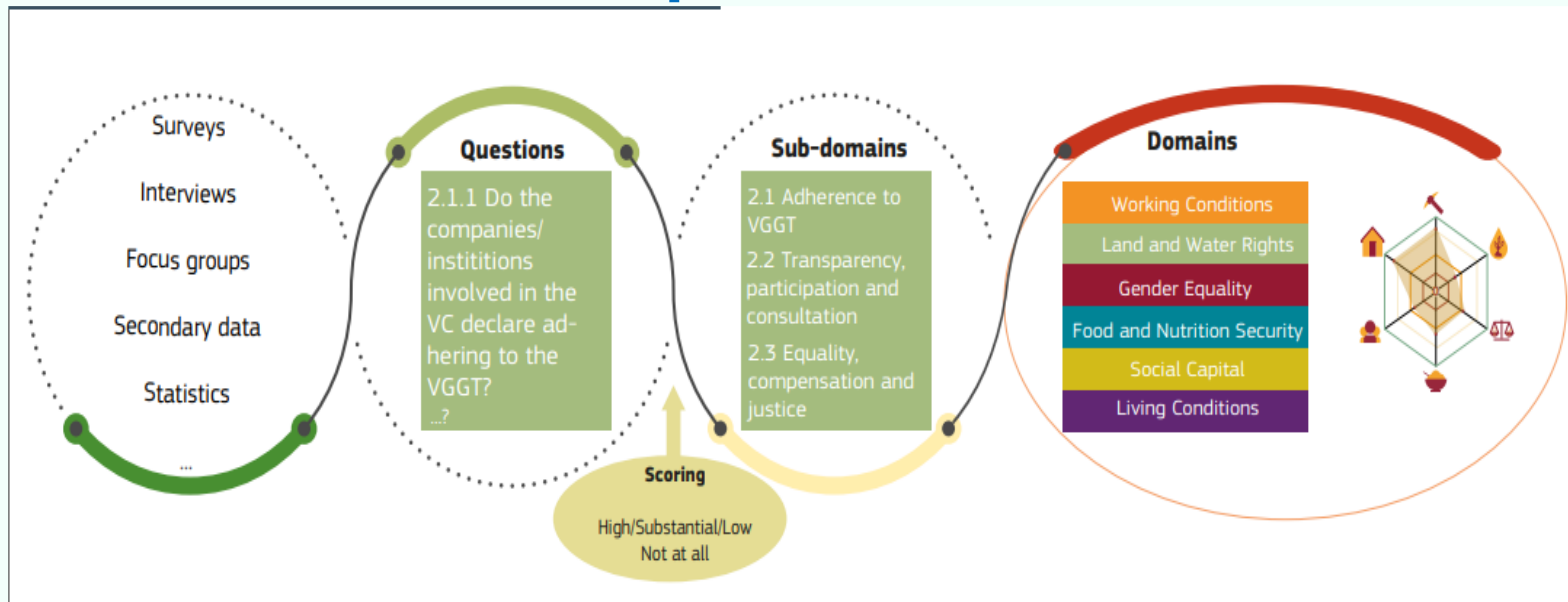
Reflection based on the Social Profile...

- Use when relevant the common typology of actors as the rest of the team → further aggregation or disaggregation can nevertheless be made. Try to understand the key benefits or disadvantages created by the VC by type of actor
- Going beyond the score, highlighting differences between types of actors, or geographical regions...
- Highlighting the critical points that can be hidden behind the score of a domain
- Try to discern the societal context from the VC specific one (problems of attributions in certain situation if the VC is a relative small part of a farmers activity)
- Adding some elements relative to the territory and qualitative analysis (complementing quantitative indicators)

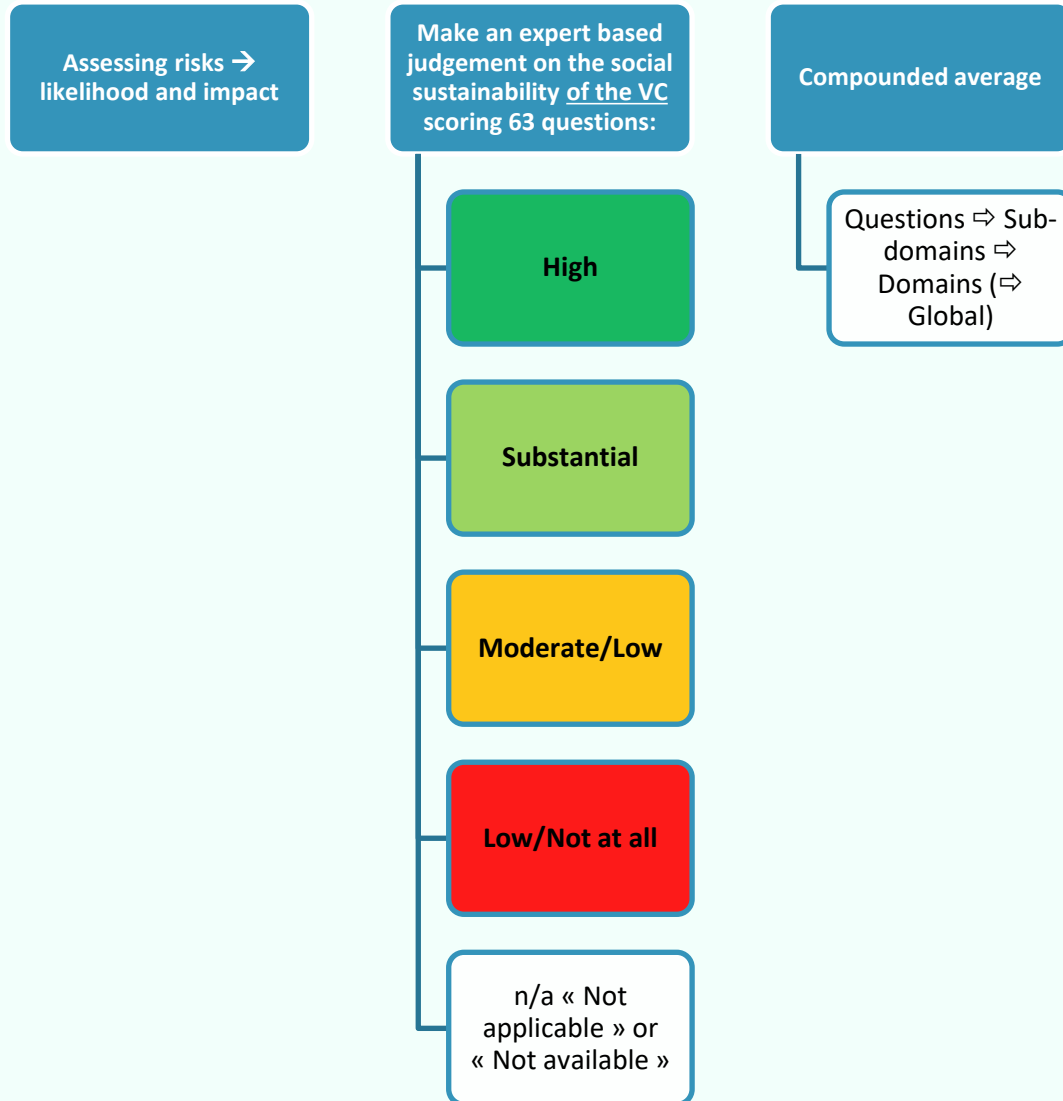

- Not all single question to reply if not relevant
- Questions relate to common concerns to policy makers (and their strategic goals)
- They can be adjusted to the context (they have been designed to embrace all VCs and all countries...)

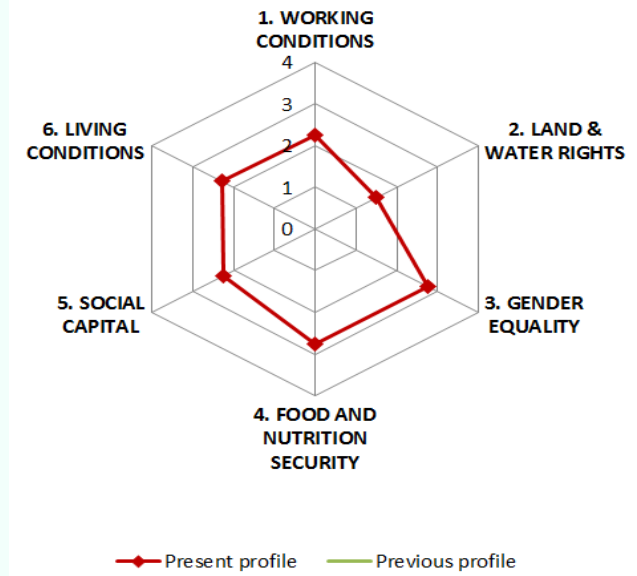


