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The European Development Days (EDD) are Europe's leading forum on development and international cooperation. Organised by the European Commission, the forum brings the development community together to share ideas and experiences in ways that inspire new partnerships and innovative solutions to the world's most pressing challenges.

Each year, the EDD attract more than 5,000 participants from over 140 countries, representing 1,200 organisations from the development community. The forum fosters a true spirit of partnership with all development actors. Since its launch in 2006, the forum has been an incubator of new ideas to bring about real change towards a poverty-free, sustainable and fairer world where everyone has a chance at a decent life.

This year's edition of the European Development Days (EDD2016) will take place in Brussels on 15 & 16 June 2016. For its tenth edition, the EDD will be one of the first international conferences to address the way forward for the 2030 Agenda.

On the occasion of its tenth anniversary, European Development Days 2016 (EDD2016) will serve as a cornerstone event in the international and European agenda in bringing together leaders, practitioners and policy-makers, to share analysis, shape best practice and map priorities for the future. The forum will have the opportunity to be one of the first major international events to address the way forward for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, following its adoption by the international community at the UN Summit held on 25-27 September 2015. The thread of this edition will focus on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Indeed, the 17 SDGs at the core of the 2030 Agenda will frame global efforts for the coming 15 years to eradicate poverty and to achieve sustainable development. The real test is of course implementation: 2016 is a key year to move from commitment to action.

Commissioner Mimica is clear: “Never has the international community had the potential to make such a difference with its work. I strongly believe that the 2030 Agenda, with the SDGs at its core, can be a game-changer. It is ambitious but achievable.”

The title for the tenth edition of the EDD will reflect this call for global engagement: “Sustainable Development Goals in Action: Our World, Our Dignity, Our Future”.

The 2030 Agenda is underpinned by an ambitious Global Partnership. All stakeholders – governments, international organisations, private sector, civil society, academia, scientific community, citizens...- have a role to play and a meaningful contribution to make. The EDD are a perfect opportunity to illustrate how the EU is committed to this inclusive approach, in uniting the global community and being a platform to explore means of tackling global challenges together.

/ Themes and topics

Under the main thread of the Sustainable Development Goals, the EDD agenda will be structured around the '5 Ps' in the preamble of the 2030 Agenda:

People, Planet, Prosperity, Peace and Partnership.

All '5 Ps' are equally important, interrelated and indivisible when addressing the various dimensions of the 2030 Agenda. Sessions at EDD2016 must therefore adopt an integrated approach when addressing specific topics, to highlight the interlinked nature of the Sustainable Development Goals and the projects that will address them.

Each of the five 'P' themes will include three topics which will form the basis for stands and sessions organised at EDD2016.

/ Inclusiveness

EDD2016 will have a diverse array of participants that represent the diversity of the development community. This year, we are placing special emphasis on addressing issues with an integrated approach, with each session required to reflect overarching themes, such as gender or inclusiveness.

Session organisers are required to pay particular attention to the following elements:

- Gender is a cross-cutting theme that should be included in each session or activity.
- Engaging with youth is highly recommended for all sessions. Auditorium debates will be required to include one speaker from the EDD2016 Young Leaders Programme.
- We recommend that Auditorium debates pay particular attention to the balance of sector representation when choosing their speakers. Special consideration will be given to the involvement of private sector representatives during the selection of the sessions.
- This year the EDD wish to have more representatives from the field. We encourage session organisers to include 'success stories' and field representatives in their sessions, whenever it is relevant.

Please remember that the EDD2016 Selection Committee will pay close attention to inclusiveness as a whole when evaluating session proposals, to ensure that everyone has a voice at the EDD.

As in previous editions, this year's programme will be structured around a series of panel debates to discuss development policies. We rely on session organisers to develop thought-provoking proposals and lead innovative panels. Session Organisers can choose between two different debate formats: Auditorium debates (High-level Panels) or Lab debates.

/ Auditorium debates

Since auditorium sessions gather high-level profile speakers, they are highly visible segments of the programme. The Steering Committee has pre-identified this year's topics to correspond with auditorium sessions.

Auditorium Session Organisers must lead a high-level panel in an auditorium.

Selection criteria

We will assess applications to organise an Auditorium debate based on four criteria:

- Content Approach – 40%
- Inclusiveness – 30%
- Communication – 15%
- Interactivity – 15%

Content approach

Auditorium debates must be lively and interactive and built upon overarching opinions and conflicting perspectives. We highly recommend using the EDD2016 app. In order to ensure debates lead to an outcome, panellists should agree on three to five closing findings or recommendations. The moderator should be well informed of these key elements to orient the debates effectively.


Inclusiveness – New actors and youth speakers

As part of our evaluation, we will consider the diversity of speakers and the strategy to engage new and emerging development actors.

Each Auditorium debates will be required to include a representative from the EDD2016 Young Leaders Programme. The Steering Committee will pre-select the three most qualified youth candidates for each topic and then give session organisers the final choice. The final candidate will be selected according to their expertise and knowledge of the topic addressed in the panel, as well as their public speaking skills.

Content approach – Debates


Session organisers should develop debates based on overarching views of development actors and include thought-provoking content. Lab debates must be interactive, engaging and avoid the show-and-tell approach of presentation panels.

Inclusiveness – New actors and youth speakers


Creating an inclusive forum with a wide range of diverse actors, especially regarding, gender, youth and private sector, is a key value for EDD2016.

Interactivity – Moderation and App

Moderation is key to the success of sessions. The moderator will introduce and close the session, organise the debates with the speakers and lead the Q&A with the audience. We recommend that you choose your moderator carefully, and ensure that he or she uses the EDD App to increase interaction with the audience. / The EDD Village

The EDD Village is a particularly exciting platform featuring stands that showcase successful projects and groundbreaking reports from around the world. The Village will be the focal point of the EDD2016 venue and will serve as a crossroads for interaction, innovation and networking among participants. The Village will be a place to dive into the core topics of the EDD.

Inclusiveness is a key value for EDD2016. We welcome exhibitors from around the globe to reflect the diversity of the development community. We have a particular interest in stands proposing success stories from the field. We encourage exhibitors to invite actors from the field to interact with visitors and participants and promote their local projects and success stories.

A dedicated youth area will be a key element of the EDD Village to encourage interaction and emphasise their contribution. A permanent stage will be installed within the EDD Village for live performances, as well as a coffee corner.

At every level, participants, moderators and speakers from around the world can put forward their ideas and examine creative solutions to solve the most pressing development challenges.

Content approach


Brainstorming labs are interactive, topic-oriented sessions that enable participants to roll up their sleeves and propose recommendations that reflect the creative energy of our community. Lasting 75 minutes, brainstorming sessions are the ideal format to showcase new ideas and breakthrough practices. They can also produce concrete recommendations through group problem solving. An editorial artist will sketch all brainstorming sessions live and publish resulting drawings for the public.

Communication and data sharing

Selected session organisers and exhibitors are strongly invited to prepare and share press releases and infographics to promote their session and provide key information about their specific topic.

Infographics are an important tool to engage the development community and provide them with key facts and figures.

Press releases will need to present the session, announce the speakers involved as well as background information about their session. A newsworthy press release will be a useful background document for journalists.

To ensure a good visibility to your organisation or your project, we encourage you to:

- Grab attention with a strong headline
- Get right to the point in the first paragraph
- Pack your press release with hard numbers, concrete outcomes that support the significance of your project or initiative
- Keep it short and simple: the ideal length of a press release is 1500 characters, including spaces, which represents an A4 page.

The EDD aspire to be an inclusive forum that represents the diversity of the development community. In this spirit, we encourage session organisers and the community at large to engage new voices and emerging actors in development.

Youth are a driving force behind some of the most important development issues. Sharing their views and experiences is a priority. EDD2016 will host a variety of activities under the EDD2016 Youth Agenda to encourage greater youth participation.

EDD2016 will invite 16 Young Leaders to participate in the Auditorium debates of the forum, giving youth participants a real seat at the table. In parallel to this initiative, EDD2016 will encourage the community to organise youth-related activities, in order to highlight challenges that affect young people and showcase how youth can play an active role in bringing concrete solutions. We invite pro-active and dynamic young people to participate in the EDD2016 Youth Agenda, and the community to promote these opportunities across their networks.

/ Young leaders programme

Following the successes of last year's Youth Programme, EDD2016 will continue to host the Young Leaders Programme, inviting exceptional youth representatives to speak at the high-level panels of the forum. Together, the EDD2016 Team and Auditorium session organisers will select 16 young people from across the world who have demonstrated their expertise and leadership on one of the EDD2016 topics. Young Leaders will be invited to Brussels to share their projects and experiences, as well as engage with delegations from governments and international organisations.

Auditorium session organisers will select one of the suggested Young Leaders to speak in their panel. The EDD2016 Team will present three candidates to session organisers, who will then choose the most suitable youth speaker for their panel.

Future leaders selection criteria

We will assess applications to the Young leaders programme based on three key elements:

- Knowledge, experience and demonstrated impact related to their selected topic.
- Public speaking skills and motivation to participate.
- Leadership experience within an informal or formal organisation.

Like all large-scale summits do, EDD2016 will generate a significant carbon footprint. It would be irresponsible to organise a meeting to address the world's development challenges without considering its impact on the environment. We will conserve paper and offset our carbon to reduce the EDD's environmental impact.

/ We conserve paper

The EDD will be as paperless as possible. Upon arrival, participants will only receive a printed programme and a list of speakers and participating organisations. They will not receive welcome packs or other publications. We prefer instead to distribute this information online using the EDD App, the EDD website and social media platforms.

We are limiting the use of roll-ups to remain consistent with our environmental ethic. Organisers can only bring roll-ups (one per organisation) to display in rooms during their sessions. All roll-ups should be removed at the end of each session. Each stand exhibitors will be permitted to hold one roll-up within the premises of their stand.

/ We offset carbon

Session organisers will offset a certain quantity of carbon, depending on the selected session. When paying the total fees, you will be able to choose the carbon offset project that you wish to support among a suggested list that will be available as of 4 April on the [EDD website](#).

No split billing will be accepted. The focal point's organisation will be the sole responsible for the payment of the session.

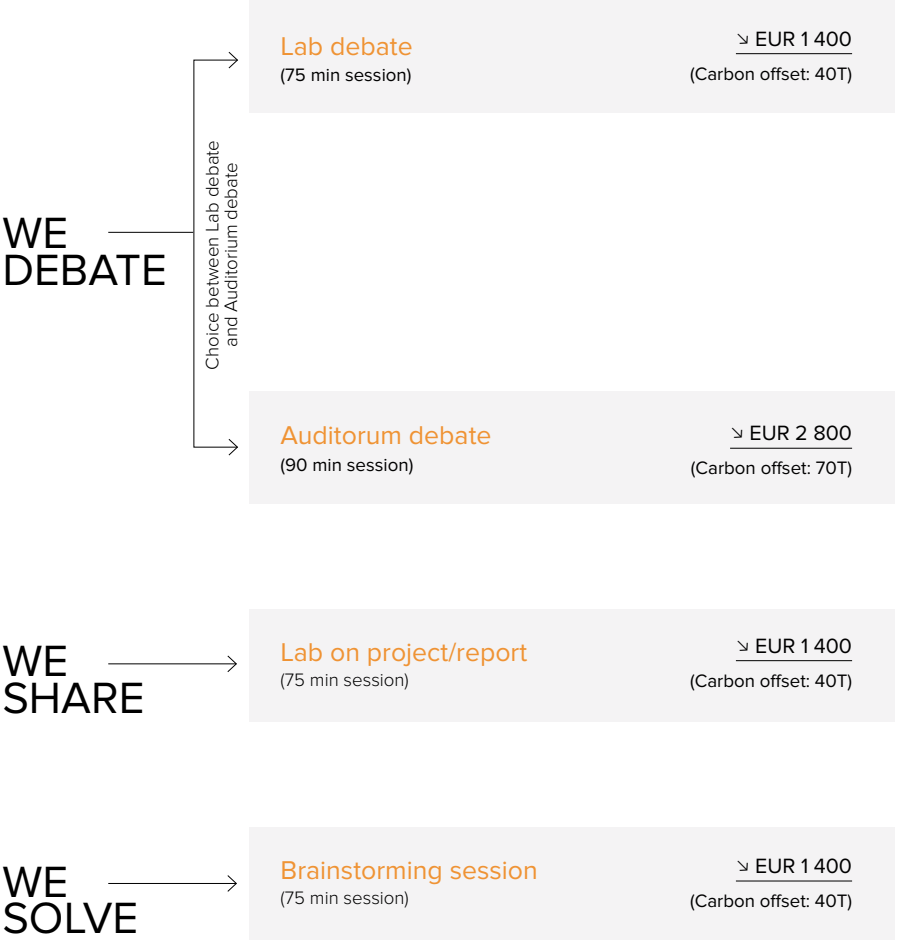
