Did you know?

It is estimated that about 1 million Roma¹ live in the Western Balkans, 2.8 million in Turkey and 6.2 million in the EU. Roma are Europe's largest ethnic minority. They face continued exclusion, segregation and discrimination.

The EU's policy on Roma inclusion, integration and empowerment is placed within an EU Framework for National Roma Integration Strategies up to 2020 adopted by the European Commission in 2011. Within that framework, all 28 EU Member States and all 7 candidate countries and potential candidates for EU membership adopted their National Roma Integration Strategies which they now put in practice.

In June 2016, the Commission adopted its annual report on Roma integration that stresses the following as regards the candidate countries and potential candidates:

- Roma integration continues to be a priority in the enlargement process.
- Enough funding must be ensured to carry out integration measures.
- Attention should focus on implementation by local authorities.
- Roma community should be involved in planning, implementation and monitoring.
- Focus on results on the ground to reduce the gap between Roma and non-Roma.

NGO "Disutni Albania", in Korca was founded in March 1995 and was registered as a legal entity in the Court of First Instance in Tirana on 25.01.2002 (no protocol 117). At the begining its organizational activities were primarily local-oriented. In November 2011, the organization "Disutni Albania", started to appear in the bilingual TV show in English and Romani language, titled; "KNOW US BEFORE YOU JUDGE US", sponsored by UNICEF. In 2002, NGO "Disutni Albania", in collaboration with other charitable organizations supported Roma families in need, with food packages. In the same year, our NGO implemented another project, financially supported by Soros; "Roma integration through its values".

Disutni Albania implemented a project: "Roma community awareness for participating in the 2005 elections" funded by USAID & PARTNER INDIA. Since 2005, NGO "Disutni Albania" has organized and supported many concerts held for the occasion of International Roma Day on April 8;

In collaboration with the Albanian Red Cross and Roma Youth Forum, "Disutni Albania" has worked to improve the living conditions of Roma people in need, time after time.

Implementations of many other projects in collaboration with other Albanian and Roma organizations as The Social Club of Korca Civil Society who have offered their partnership with our organization.

In Collaboration with the Municipality of Korca, facilitation of Roma community participation in planting new trees in the city;

Participation in the carnival event held in Korca City;

Blood donation in the International Day of Blood Donation in cooperation with Roma Youth Forum.

In collaboration with the Albanian Public Television TVSH, "Disutni Albania" has started to broadcast a bilingual program for Roma community. In this case we have good opportunity to transmit qualitative programs for children socialization and Roma parenting motivation. We work to improve our programs daily.

From 2014 to 2016, "Disutni Albania" has implemented the Roma Versitas Program, funded by REF-Roma Education Fund, for all Roma and Egyptian students in Tirana and Korca, who needs further qualifications in computer skills, English knowledge and specific subjects from their studies. The program was very useful for our students and it will continue for two more years.

The project main objective was the increasing of the retention rate, academic performances and graduation rate, while build the self-esteem and identity of about 60 Roma/Egyptian full-time students enrolled in tertiary education in Albania in the first year and 20 new students in the second year of the project (in total 80 beneficiaries in 2 years of the project), and to improve their professional and personal skills through provision of training programs, academic tutoring and mentoring, while strengthening their Roma/Egyptian identity, over a 2-year period of time.

The project activities were concentrated in Tirana and Korça, targeting Roma and Egyptian students from all over the country attending universities in these centers. Tirana were and still is the capital and largest city of Albania. The city hosts many public institutions and public and private universities, and is the center of the political, economic, and cultural life of the country.

Korça is a city in southeastern Albania. By the number of population, it is the sixth largest city in Albania. Korça otherwise is called the capital of Roma, where a large proportion of them are located in this city. The city hosts the Fan Noli University, which offers several degrees in the humanities, sciences and business. The University includes a school in Agriculture, Teaching, Business, Nursing, and Tourism.

The project consisted on five components:

- i) Establishment of the Advisory Board, Roma Versitas Student Resource Center and Library;
- ii) Academic tutoring scheme;
- iii) Provision of Mentoring Services;
- iv) Provision of academic development services; and
- v) Student Initiatives and Projects SIP.

The PDOs outcome indicators, above listed were:

- The improvement retention rate of Roma/Egyptian students (less of 10% drop-off rate in project beneficiaries);
- To increase GPA of Roma/Egyptian students against individual baseline result increase success rate in tutoring subjects, were 80% of the 60 Roma/Egyptian students are expected to successfully pass the exam(s) in which they received tutoring);
- To improve foreign language/computer and personal skills;
- To increased community involvement of Roma/Egyptian students through 10 Student Initiatives and Projects.

Results achieved of the project (Section 5, criterion 2 of the Contest Rules):

Over the 2 years' implementation of Roma Versitas program in Albania, it is observed to be a continuation of this program, as has been observed the beneficiaries of this program have been growing not only in academic performance, also they could adapt to studies, are trained on computer programs, have advanced in English, learned more about the Roma history and language, are closer to each other, etc.

- 2 Resources Center, Tirana and Korca furnished, equipped and functional;
- Until May 2016, over 50 students benefited over 1000 hrs of tutoring, and 9 of them have been graduated successfully and 55 of them have pass successfully in the next academic year.
- Were involved over 46 tutors in different subject to assist the beneficiaries in the tutoring scheme.
- RVA Program during the first academic year 2014/2015 has successfully assisted 64 Roma students and for the second academic year 2015/2016 are 67 students. From the 55 students who were assisted for the first academic year of RVA 42 of them are continuing RV for the second academic year 2015-2016, 25 new students are new beneficiaries for the 2nd academic year of RVA, 15 students are studying for Master of Science and 52 for Bachelor. In two years of the implementation of the project and regarding exclusively to the Roma Versitas program were that the personal development skills have to be more specific and in separated courses, the students have to be pushed on the implementation of their initiatives or projects to be related to the community and to cover more Roma settlements.

In the implementation of the first two years Roma students increased their retention rate, academic performances and graduation rate, while learn more about Roma language and on Roma identity. This last have to be mention because more and more Roma students are losing their connection with the language and their identity.


Program staff included: Senior advisors, teachers, tutors, mentors, educational experts, local coordinators working with the community. Project Coordinator drafted the Advisory Board (AB) which consisted of 5 members, of whom one was be the representative of the Ministry for Education and Sports, one was a Student representative from Roma community, and one was the representative of Disutni Albania. Two more posts will given for representatives of civil society organizations, business community and academic sector. The direction scheme was: Project Coordinator; RV Resource Center coordinator; Mentors; Finance/Admin Manager. There were selected 60 tutors for 60 students, English course trainers for two level of English courses, 2 Romanae course trainers, 2 computer trainers, 2 experts for personal development worshops.
