Within that framework, all 28 EU Member States and all 7 candidate countries and potential candidates for EU membership adopted their National Roma Integration Strategies which they now put in practice.

In June 2016, the Commission adopted itsannual report on Roma integration that stresses the following as regards the candidate countries and potential candidates:

- Roma integration continues to be a priority in the enlargement process.
- Enough funding must be ensured to carry out integration measures.
- Attention should focus on implementation by local authorities.
- Roma communityshould be involved in planning, implementation and monitoring.
- Focus on results on the ground to reduce the gap between Roma and non-Roma.

Education is a basic precondition for the integration of the Roma community into society. The key to all the problems of this community in Macedonia and the region is in education. Lately in Macedonia has shown significant progress in this area at all levels of education from pre-school to higher education. In Macedonia revised the National Strategy for Roma 2014 - 2020 year and therefore the action plans for education, employment, health and housing. It confirms that already has provided the basis for building long-term sustainability of the activities that have proven visible results during the implementation of the project. The "tutoring support for Roma students who attend elementary education in Macedonia" is in direct correlation with the National Strategy for Roma in Macedonia, as well as the Education Action Plan for 2014 - 2020 year. The project is supported from the Roma Education Found from Budapest, in partnership with the Ministry of Education and Science of Republic of Macedonia. The overall objective of the project is to contribute to increase retention rate and improve educational performance/outcomes of Roma children who study in fourth, fifth, and sixth grades in primary education in Macedonia for two school years 2015/16 and 2017/18. The specific objective of the project is increasing of the retention rate and educational outcomes of min 3330 Roma students who are in 4th, 5th and 6th grade in 36 primary schools in 18 municipalities around country for two school years 2015/16 and 2016/17. The project is implemented in 18 municipalities in 36 primary schools and included a total of 3330 Roma pupils who study in the 4th, 5th and 6th grade over two academic years. The project is designed to contribute for improving educational results for pupils in primary education, increasing the level of the transfer from one department to another and increased attendance of pupils and keeping them in the education and improve their personal quality. Mostly the Roma pupils in the educational process are giving up for several reasons such as poor socio-economic status, poor knowledge of the language, the departure of Roma families in foreign countries, low awareness among the Roma community about the importance of education, etc. The objective and the activities of the project are directly aimed at promoting inclusion in the educational system by providing additional tutoring support to overcome barriers Macedonian / native language and mathematics for students in 4, 5 and 6 grades. For realization of the tutoring classes are engaged about 100 tutors, students or graduates of some of the faculties in Macedonia. The tutoring classes are implemented in partnership with primary schools and they are realized at schools premises. In addition, within the project are being undertaken activities to reduce the dropout rate of pupils in the educational process through regular monitoring the attendance of pupils and identifying not regular pupils and their return to regular education and tutoring classes. Within the project are engaged local coordinators in 18 municipalities / locations that are responsible for coordination, mediation between schools and the community, for monitoring of attendance of students and intervention to reduce the drop out. Also, the project is offering direct support to Roma families by providing educational and didactic materials for their children. Additionally within the project are organized informal educational meetings with the parents to raise their awareness for the importance of education for the success of their children and for increasing their responsibility to support their children. The results which are achieved with the project are confirmed the necessity of this intervention in primary education to promote integration and inclusion of Roma children in the education process in Macedonia. As a long-term effect from the project is expected to increase the number of Roma pupils who successfully complete primary education, increase the number of students who enrol and successfully complete secondary education, and all this will make it easier for their employment in the future.

Results achieved of the project (Section 5, criterion 2 of the Contest Rules):

The project "Tutoring support of Roma children in primary education in Republic of Macedonia" is implementing in two school years 2015/16 and 2016/17 year. According the implementation plan, the activities from the first year were implemented till 31 August 2016 year, and the second year of implementation began on 01 September 2016 year.

Achieved results in the first year of implementation of the project (2015/16):

- Increased knowledge on the subject native language by 63.12% of the students involved in tutoring classes;
- Increased knowledge in Mathematics by 68.25% of the students involved in tutoring classes;
- Reduced rash for 38 % out of the total number of the Roma students dropped out (174) who attend the 4th, 5th and 6th grade;
- 75.81% of the total number of students involved in the project attended regularly the tutoring classes;
- Of the total number of students included in the project 92.28% successfully completed the department and transferred to the subsequent grade;
- Strengthened capacities of 113 tutors to deliver the tutoring classes;

These results justify the project as an intervention in primary education from many aspects. In Consideraion that more than 60% of students have increased their knowledge on Native language and Mathematics, is a base for improving the general educational success among pupils. In addition increased attendance of the students at regular and tutoring classes is contribut to reducing the risk for students to stay out of the educational process. Especially is important that the project contribute to decrease the number of pupils who leave the school for 38%. With this, directly was prevented this children stay on the streets and practicing bad habits such as begging, use of intoxicants, delinquency, etc.. As opposed to that, these children will continue their education to acquire healthy habits, will strengthen their self confidence, will build the responsible persons and will build long-term basis for quality and proper lifestyle. Although implementation of the project in the first year showed solid results, however the need for continuation of this project in the future is in needed. Education of Roma in Macedonia and the region is a complex problem that deserves a long-term treatment. These results are a good basis for building long-term strategies and intervention programs in elementary education and support for the Roma community.

1. Management team of the project

For management and coordination of the project are engaged 6 people with full time jobs: Project manager, Project coordinator, two administrative assistants and one financial manager. All persons are members of the Roma community.

2. Support team for coordination of the project on a local level

In order to coordinate the project locally, are hired 14 local coordinators through 9 local Roma NGOs. Of these, 7 are engaged full time, and 7 are hired part time. All persons are members of the Roma community.

3. Tutors for realization of tutoring classes with the children

To deliver the tutoring classes are involved a total of 92 tutors who realize tutoring classes in 36 primary schools in 18 municipalities / locations in Macedonia. Of these 40 tutors are Roma and 52 non-Roma.

4. External consultancy expert

RRC has engaged External expert analysis and evaluation of the success and attendance of students in 36 schools in 18 municipalities / locations in Macedonia. That person is engaged full time and is member of the non-Roma community.

5. External monitoring expert

RRC has engaged External expert to monitor the level and quality of implementation of the project in 36 schools in 18 municipalities / locations in Macedonia. That person is engaged part time and is a member of the non-Roma community.

Within in the project, for the school year 2016/17 are included total of 1500 students. From them, 786 (52.4%) are female and 714 (47.6%) are male.

RRC is the leader organization of the project "Tutoring support of Roma students who study in the primary schools in the country." The project is implemented in partnership with NGO SONCE form Tetovo. Additionally, the project included a consortium of 10 NGOs responsible for the project implementation at local level. RRC is a coordinator and has responsible for the project implementation in 18 municipalities / locations in 36 primary schools in Macedonia. NGO "Sonce" as a key partner in the project is responsible for the project coordination in West Macedonia for total of 6 municipalities, under RRC's coordination. For successful coordination of all parties involved in the project, RRC organizes regular coordination meetings and create quarterly action plans for project implementation. In addition, RRC coordinates and conducts all payments which are arising from the implementation of the activities under the project. The local coordinators submit monthly reports to RRC for the implementation of the tutoring classes at the local level as well as the overall implementation of the project. RRC create general reports based on the reports from the local coordinators. RRC together with SONCE plan activities for advocacy and lobbying for the project and organize and conduct meetings with local and national institutions.

RRC as a leader in the coordinating of the project realizes, coordinates and organizes all key meetings and partnerships for the project implementation.

RRC together with the NGO SONCE realizes internal and external monitoring to determine the level and quality of the project implementation at local level. Local coordinators and NGOs involved in the project have a direct responsibility to RRC for the project implementation.

In order to supplement your requested information in accordance with, below are several projects that have been implemented within the RRC till the period to 31st of August 2016 year:

Project 1: Advocacy Camp for Roma students and students who study medicine. Pilot project implementation started in August 2010 year and was implemented until 31st July 2016. The project aim is strengthening the capacity about 100 high school and university students who study medicine to become leaders in the community and to advocate for Roma rights in health care in the country;

Project 2: Paralegal assistance to the Roma community in the municipality of Suto Orizari. Project implementation began on 1st of June 2012 year and runs until 1st of December 2016 year. The project aim is to provide access of the Roma community to the services in the field of health and fulfilment of their health rights;

Project 3: Building of educational opportunities for children from vulnerable categories. The project aim was Assessment of opportunities for development of long-term programs for positive educational changes. The project was implemented from 01st July 2014 year till 01st June 2015 year;

Project 4: Tutoring support for Roma children who are included in 2nd, 3rd and 4th grade in primary education in Shuto Orizari. The project aim was Providing additional educational (tutoring) support for minimum 500 maximum 750 students at the Primary school "Brothers Ramiz and Hamid" in Shuto Orizari during the school year 2014/15. This project was implemented in the period from 01st of July 2014 year to 31st of July 2015 year.
