Regional Policies

- African Union Decisions on Climate Change – Climate Change received high political profile (2007, 2009 – 2016)
- High Level Work Programe on Climate Change Action in Africa (WPCCAA) – adopted 2014
- Draft African Strategy on Climate Change



Regional Policies Contd.

- Climate related Policies
 - Africa Regional Strategy on Disaster Risk Reduction (2004) and its Programme of Action (2005 & 2011) – currently being aligned with Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction
 - ❖Implemented in collaboration with African Ministers responsible for DRR; African Regional Platform and African Working Group on DRR under the AU Specialized Technical Committee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Water and Environment (ARDWE)



Regional Policies Contd.

- Climate related Policies
 - Commitment on Water and Sanitation (famously known as Sharm El-Sheikh Declaration on Water and Sanitation
 - AU Decision on Kigali Action Plan (KAP)
 - African Ministers responsible for DRR under AU Specialized Technical Committee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Water and Environment (ARDWE)



Regional Policies Contd.

- Climate related Policies
 - African Ministers responsible for DRR under the Integrated African Policy on Meteorology (Weather and Climate Services)
 - ❖Implemented in collaboration with African Ministerial Conference on Meteorology (AMCOMET) under AU Specialized Technical Committee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Water and Environment (ARDWE)

- African Union Commission (AUC)
- NEPAD Planning and Coordinating Agency (NPCA)
- African Development Bank (AfDB)
- UN Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA)

- Ensure Diplomatic Missions in Addis Ababa, New York, Brussels, Nairobi, Geneva, Paris, Washington D.C. and to incorporate the African Climate Change Agenda in strategic diplomatic issues to enhance Africa's interest on climate change;

Africa's Engagement @ COP 22 (1)

- Africa negotiating as a group under leadership of: African Group of Negotiators on Climate Change (AGN) and Ministers – AMCEN and with political directive of CAHOSCC for Africa to continue to speak with one voice in global negotiations
 - Other key players include: Pan African
 Parliamentarians (PAP) and Parliamentarians from
 AU Member States; African Civil Society Group
 under PACJA; Researchers and Academia; and
 Media Practitioners

Africa's Engagement @ COP 22 (2)

- African Pavilion (Side Events and Exhibitions) to showcase success stories in Africa
- Africa Day 16 November 2016



Challenges

- Requirements include:
 - Funds to support AGN Members to COP22
 - More Partners to support the two initiatives Africa launched at COP 21
 - More Partners to come on board to support the Regional institutions in implementation of Regional Climate Change Policies to facilitate implementation of Paris Agreement (Capacity Building; Technology Development and Transfer; Finance; etc)
