From Paris to Marrakech and beyond



- 1. The adoption of the historical Paris Agreement marks a <u>new era</u> of global co-operation to address climate change.
- 2. Concrete steps must be taken <u>now</u> to achieve climate targets.
- 3. Paris delivered an agreement. Marrakesh must deliver action.
- 4. <u>Climate Action is development action</u>. Therefore, linkages between climate action and (sustainable) development action must be understood, articulated and integrated in planning; delivering and measuring action.



From Paris to Marrakech and beyond



- 5. Action on climate change must be <u>inclusive</u>, <u>gender-responsive</u> and <u>must prioritize the poorest and most vulnerable</u>
- 6. A <u>dual approach to mitigation and adaptation</u> is essential: those already being impacted by climate change must be supported.
- 7. Continued support to <u>national leadership</u> is essential.
- 8. Adequate finance is essential.
- 9. <u>Innovative partnerships</u> are critical
