HO.- An integrated approach to protection and other sectors:

Example:

Some IDP from an informal settlement in a village used to do occasional jobs in a nearby town, but the army has set up checkpoints on the road and usually mistreat and extort IDP when they pass through them; a few IDP have been disappeared also. Now IDP are scared to go to town and there is increasing food insecurity among the most vulnerable IDP in the settlement.

An integrated approach to this situation (integrating Protection and Food Assistance):

Protection objectives bring about outcomes in other

sector

IDP are entitled to freedom of movement as any other citizen. Humanitarian agencies start advocating for it before local authorities and promote accompaniment of IDP groups when travelling to town.

After some time and many meetings, IDP are able to travel again to town and food security improves again

Other sector objectives bring about outcomes in

protection

 \bigcirc

Temporary food assistance is provided to the most vulnerable households

IDP can avoid being exposed to physical harm in checkpoints.
