This project is being developed to assist artisans in the ceramic industry with business and product development support. Also to assist the artisans from the UNDP/AMGC program with business and product development aspect of the trainings that they would be delivering to their respective communities.

A draft plan for the establishment of business incubation facilities for the ceramic industry.

What were the expected outcomes and what outcomes did you achieve?

Expected Outcome: The knowledge gained in Tanzania will be the platform for JBDC with the participation of the artisans as co-trainers, to deliver capacity building programmes to individuals and communities across Jamaica, e.g. through JBDC's Mobile Business Clinic Initiative (MBCI), the establishment of business incubation facilities for the ceramic industry and individual enterprise consultation. The focus of these

interventions will be on enhancing productive skills and business development.

Outcomes Achieved: A list of equipment required for a ceramics incubator has been developed through consultations with the AMGC and artisans in the industry. We (JBDC) are currently looking at options to fund the purchase of these items, the UNDP small grants scheme being one such possible source.

Some of the artisans who participated in the training at AMGC have been conducting training for either persons working with them or persons in their surrounding communities. I have been collaborating with them on developing a workshop covering specific areas of business that they have identified in which we have expertise, for example product costing and pricing.

Two of the artisans from the UNDP/AMGC training program participated in the JBDC/WIPO (World Intellectual Property Organisation) Workshop.

Three (3) artisans were able to display their ceramic products at the JBDC/WIPO workshop which was held for three (3) days at JBDC. Mines and Geology Division was also able to display samples of local clays samples collected showing the connection from raw material to an end product.

The RWP has allowed me to have a much broader understanding of the ceramic industry and its' value chain through the constant interaction of the training and study tour participants.
