General Information:

Basalt outcrops almost everywhere in the Northwest Region as massive or columnar basalts. Its abundance here is obvious, owing to the fact that, part of the region form the Cameroon Volcanic line(CVL), which runs from the Adamawa through the Bamenda Highlands, the Western plateaux to Mount Cameroon. Basalt is generally mined artisanally considering the industrial /artisanal ratio. Artisanal mining of basalt is common in Bui and Mezam Divisions registering over 70 legal (authorized) miners and used mostly for construction purposes. In addition to the legal miners, there are a lot more operating in illegality, with ignorance as regard environmental concerns, health and safety, as well as limitations is the use of basalt.

Brief description of the project:;

Organisation and Valorisation of Basalt mined artisanally for domestic development in council areas with specific aims as;

- Identification of talent for the process chain
- Organisation of the sector
- Legalisation of activity
- Awareness on the processing and different uses of basalt (valorisation)
- Social impact (Community, Environment, Health and safety awareness)

Expected results:

- Miners with talent in seizing and shaping of basalt will be identified
- Miners will be organised into groups, each group made of miners with different talents.
- Many more authorised miners and increase in tax collection.
- Transformation of basalt into various shapes (square, hexagonal, rectangular, round etc) and aggregates and used for decorative and construction (council roads and houses) purposes.
- Creation of jobs and better standard on living in the community
- Increase awareness on environmental management, health and safety
