There exist currently 56 functional artisanal miners specialised in Semi-pressures and pressures stones specifically Sapphire in the locality, only the youthful population is involve. Due to the recent recording of numerous working related accidents, and other health and safety related issues in the community, this project seeks to address such constrains as well as how they can be tackled

It was attended by 42 people, 22 males and 20 females giving the gender balance of 52.38% and 47.62% respectively
- Education of over 1000 people from the 17th to 22rd April 2017 at the national museum Yaounde-Cameroon during the first edition of young Cameroonian entrepreneur forum
- Successful dialogue traditional authorities in Mbiame Fon's Palace
- Introduction of good mining practices in regards to community, health and safety issues
