GENERAL INFORMATION

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Brief Description of the project: Tanzanian Government is implementing its Industrialization policy, which aiming to deepening the private sector-led industrial growth as a way of transforming the economy from its heavy reliance on agriculture. Two major policy documents cater for economic transformation through industrialization. They are the Tanzania Development Vision (TDV) 2025 and the Sustainable Industrial Development Policy for Tanzania (SIDP 2020). Toward implementation of these policies, the role of Development Minerals should be consolidated, as they play crucial roles in industries such as construction, manufacturing and agriculture (Daniel et al, 2016.)

This project intends to assist the Government to achieve its goals by undertaking following key tasks:

- i) To review and in cooperate ACP EU Development Minerals course contents into the existing university Undergraduate course(Industrial minerals and rocks (GY402)
- ii) To organize Development Minerals student awareness day at the University of Dar es Salaam, aiming to raise awareness and sensitize undergraduate students on the roles of the development minerals toward industrialization in Tanzania.
- iii) To design and delivery outreach program for the selected Secondary school in the city of Dar es salaam in collaboration with African Minerals and Geoscience Centre (AMGC)
- iv) Designing and delivery short courses for Artisanal and Small scale Miners on grading of gypsum for value addition









Expected Outcomes:

- (i) Development minerals course contents to be in cooperated into existing industrial minerals and rocks undergraduate course (GY 402)
- (ii) Increases awareness to more than 300 Undergraduate students on Development Minerals
- (iii) Development minerals to be introduced to Secondary school students in Dar es Salaam
- (iv) Training to be delivered to artisanal and Small scale miners on grading of gypsum for value addition
