This will be done mainly by incorporating the development minerals curricula into community trainings on mineral rights and entitlements, value addition. On the other hand CSO players in the mineral sector will be provided with key information materials on the ACP-EU development minerals programme throughout the year especially using several CSO platforms

The project PDMEDU will also focus on empowering local governments in the mining districts of Karamoja sub region in Uganda to understand development minerals and their economic value.

Further PDMEDU will focus on generating case examples that will be used as evidence for the development minerals sector. In addition for strategic media articles will be published in both online and print media to generate debate and create awareness to the general public on the development minerals opportunities and constraints
