WE HAVE COMMENCED THE IMPLEMENTATION OF OUR RWP BY SETTING UP A STRATEGIC COMMITTEE IN OUR STATE TO IMPLEMENT THE RWP. WE HAVE HELD A STAKEHOLDERS MEETING WITH THE PLAYERS IN THE SOLID MINERALS SECTOR AND WE HAVE COMMENCED THE PROCESS OF GROUPING THEM INTO CLUSTERS AND COOPERATIVES.

AS WE GO FURTHER, WE INTEND TO EXPOSE THEM TO GREATER CAPACITY IN THEIR FIELD AND TO DO SO, WE WOULD REQUIRE CONSTANT CAPACITY BUILDING OURSELVES TO BE ABLE TO KEEP THE MINERS DULY INFORMED AND INNOVATE NEW WAYS OF SOLVING THEIR PROBLEMS AND CHALENGES.
